funeral Expenses and I Give & Bequeath unto Benja Addison
of Charles Town Saddler all & singular my Estate real & Personal
of what nature or kind the same may be or whenever
the same may be found to hold to him the said Benjamin
Addison his heirs & assigns forever and I hereby nominate &
appoint the said Benjamin Addison whole & Sole Exor. of this
my last will & Testament hereby Revoking all former
& other will & wills by me at any time heretofore made
Declaring this only to be my last will & Testament and I
do likewise Revoke & hereby declare null & void all writings
or Writings deed or deeds wh^o or whereby my negro
man slave named Thi^x used or mentioned
(or Manumitted or set free after my decease hereby
Declaring such freedom of ^{Thi^x} Slave was not my intention
but that he should be sold for payment of my just
debts if necessary and I hereby declare the said negro
Kingston to be part & parcel of my Estate above mentioned
In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand &
seal the twenty third day of Jan^y in the year of our
Lord one thousand seven hundred & fifty

my Exors. herein after mentioned & as for such worldly Estate
wherewith I have pleased God to bless me I Give Devise and
Bequeath the same as follows first I Give & Bequeath to my
dearly beloved Wife Hannah the sum of five hundred pounds
Lawful money of the Province after about Item I Give &
Bequeath to my said wife twenty five negro Slaves all
of them to be Chosen for out of my whole stock of Slaves
left behind Decem^r Item I Give & Bequeath
to my sd Wife with Malagony cane & all my
old & new ^{x all missing in our boat} brought Plate or Plate cup Silver
or Masses or part one part the other to be chosen by her out of all
the Houses and man^{er} belonging to me Item I Give Devise &
Bequeath to my said wife Hannah the heirs forever my
Plantation of Wherry on Great Ogee River consisting of
three tracts of one hundred Acres each on the main
Land & one tract of three hundred Acres on an Island
opposite thereto bought of Principal Parley with the
