1748 I Benjamin Baker of Berkeley County in the Province of South
Carolina Planter being very weak in body but of Perfect mind & Memory
thanks be given unto God therefore Calling to mind the Mortality of my Body &
knowing that it is Appointed for all men once to die do make & ordain this
my Last Will & Testament That is to say Principally & first of all I do give
& Recommend my Soul unto God that gave it; and my Body to the Earth to be
decently Buried at the Discretion of my Executors Nothing Daring but at ye
general Resurrection I shall receive the Same again by the mighty power
of God. And as touching such worldly Estate wherewith it hath pleased God
to bless me in this Life I dispose of in the following manner & form
In primis my Will is that my funeral Charges together with all others
of my Lawfull Debt be fully Discharged & Paid Herein I give & Bequeath
unto my my beloved Wife one best feather bed & bedding & Parillion & all
her Wearing apparel & two Large Trunks; and one horse named Terrory
& Womens Saddle & Bridle Here I Leave unto my my Wife full &
uninterrupted Lease Comfortably to dwell on my Plantation on Ashley River
where I now live During her Widowhood not so that my said Plantation
be not abused of which my Executors shall be judges From as to the Rest of
my houses & Battle Houseland goods & Plantation Tools or all my other Per-
sonal Estate my Will is that the Same be Sold Excepting so many of these
things as my Ex^{rs} shall think fit and Convenient to keep for the use & Benefit of my
Beloved Son John & Excepting a Negro Wench named Affy & her two Children
which said three Slaves I do give & Bequeath unto my my beloved wife
Likewise my Will is that my Negro Girl named Affy be with my wife

untill my Little Son John shall become one year older than he now is Here
my will is that afterwards this said Girl Affy shall be either Sold or kept for
my Beloved Son John to whom I give and Bequeath her just as my Executors shall
think fit Herein I do give & Bequeath all the Rest of my Slaves not above mentioned
named Duce, George, Robin, Abram, Maria, Diana, Mingo, Buash, Belinda &
Judy to my said Son John Baker and also my Tract of Land on Ashley River
Containing ^{four hundred} (400) acres and do hereby leave & give my Executors a
full Discretionary Power either to sell these said Legacies of Lands & Slaves -
Bequeathed to my Son John & Put out ye money upon interest for him or keep them
in possession & use just as they shall think most proper Herein in case my said Son
John shall die before he comes of age my will is that all my Estate given to him
shall be given to & become ye rights of his Son or Daughter Lawfully begotten if
any such shall then Subsist: But in case of a failure herein I do give and
Bequeath all the said Estate unto the heirs Lawfully begotten of my several
Brothers William, Elihu & James Baker to be Equally Divided
between them and to prevent all misunderstandings & disputes I do hereby
declare that this my Last Will & Testament shall be construed & understood
According to the most Liberal and Obvious meaning thereof. And I do hereby
Constitute & Ordain my Father in Law John Jenkins & my Brother Elihu
Baker to be Executors of this my Last Will & Testament utterly Disavowing
all former Wills & Testaments & declaring this & no other to be my Last Will &
Testament In Witness Whereof I have hereunto Set my Hand & Seal the
day & year above Written
