County in the Province of South Carolina Planter have made and declar'd my last Will and  
Testament Contained in the two within Sheets of Paper bearing late the Twenty  
first day of January in the Year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and forty  
three years since the making of my said Will I have purchased the Free  
taine tract of land lying on the Northside of Stoney River which said

Item To my Daughter Elizabeth in land of next Castle Item  
Five Pounds annuit money of said Province & wherowever is  
disatisfied the above Donations I heartily desire that it is my Will and pleasure  
that so or portion thereof shall be allotted to the party so disatisfied but  
be divided in proportion to the others that are satisfied. Item that my  
funeral charges & debts be paid first out of my Estate Real & Personal in Proportion  
to each other & I likewise make certain Constitutes & appoint John Dick & Dan'l  
Wilson as only and sole Executors of this my last Will and Testament & I do hereby  
revoke renounce and disallow all Wills Testaments bequests Legacies &c by me in any  
ways before this time Willed and bequeathed ratifying & Confirming this and other  
to be my last Will and Testament In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my  
hand and seal the day & year above written

Item I give to my well beloved Cousin Henry Wood but whom I chuse Constitution make and ordain my sole Executrix of this my last will and Testament all and Singular my said relation I now leave Containing fifty Acres or thereabouts with the house together with one negro Woman named Rose and her Child named Caesar and a horse and one marr and likewise all my household Goods and all my Stock of Cattle & Hogs together with all the whole real & Personal Estate Iam in Possession of by him freely to be Possessed and Enjoyed him and his heirs to be Enjoyed forever and I do hereby Utterly Disallow Anye & All such other former Testaments wills legacies Bequests & Executrix by me before this time named will and Bequeathed Ratifying & Confirming this and no other to be my last will & Testament in Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand & seal the day and year above written
