Legacies hereafter mentioned and funeral Charges may be discharged —
Item I will and desire my Loving Friend John Deas Merchant in Charles
Town may be my Sole Heir and Executor of all my Estate both Real
and Personal and that the said John Deas will not sell neither Land nor
Negroes but Continue them in the name and in case of the Decease of
said John Deas without Male Issue then to go to David Deas his Male Heir
but if neither John nor David Deas should have male Issue then to go
to the next of the name by nearness of blood, Item I Give and bequeath
to my Loving Friend David Deas Merchant in Charles Town Five hundred
Pounds Currency, Item I Give and Bequeath to my Loving Friend Robert
Kaper in Charles Town Five Hundred Pound Currency, Item I Give
and Bequeath for the Use of Prince William Church one Hundred pounds
Currency Item I Give and bequeath for the use of Stoney Creek Meeting
one hundred pounds Currency Given under my hand and Seal this
fifteenth day of November Anno Domini One thousand seven hun
dred and fifty eight and in the Thirty Second Year of his Majesty's Reign

in the Province of South Carolina Planter being Sick and Weak of body
but of sound mind and memory thanks be given to God therefore calling
to mind the mortality of my body and knowing that it is Appointed for all
men once to die do make and Ordain this my Last Will and Testament
That is to say Principally and first of all I Give and recommend my
Soul into the hands of almighty God that gave it, and my body I Give
and recommend to the Earth to be buried in Christian decent Burial
at the discretion of my Executors nothing doubting but at the general
Resurrection I shall Receive the Same Again by the mighty Power
of God and as touching such worldly Estates wherewith it hath Pleas'd
God to bless me in this Life I Give devise and dispose of the Same in the
following manner and form Inprimis I Give to my Eldst Son Alex
ander Dingle all my Real Estate and to his heirs and Assigns for ever.
Item I Give and bequeath all my Personal Estates of what kind or
nature soever, to all my Children Equally to be divided amongst

67 them And to be enjoyed by them, as they become of Age respectively
to their heirs and Assigns Item I order that sundry Bonds and Notes
I be taken up and paid for and on Account of Jonathan Wood deceased
executed by him in his Life time which I've neglected to charge in my
Account against that Estate may be charged And added to that Account
by my Executors, which Bonds and notes I omitted to be charged may
be found among my papers, Item It is my desire that my Nephews and those
of my Nephews and Neices (the Children of the said Jonathan Wood
deceased) should be kept together upon my Plantation & be employed
at such work as my Executors most Expedient for the advantage
of my Children and my said Nephew and Neice Item I thought
proper to make mention in this my said Will (to prevent Mistakes)
of the Number and names of the Slaves which are my property to
distinguish them from those belonging to my Nephew & Neice which
are as follows Vint Cogo, late Kaga, old Amy and young Amy (Five)
in all belongs to me and Simon Cain, Atta, Chloe, Daphne, Tony, Ned
and Linda belongs to my said Nephew and Neice Eight in all Item
I hereby constitute make and Ordain my beloved friend Messrs Isaac
Porcher Edward Coram and my said Nephew Jonathan Wood my
Executors of this my Last will and Testament hereby disannulling
revoking and disallowing all and every former Testaments Wills lega-
cies and bequests Cashing and confirming this and no other to be my
Last Will and Testament In Witness whereof I have hereunto set
my Seal the Eighteenth day of March in the year of our Lord One thousand
Seven hundred and fifty Eight
