Item I give the other third part of my moveable Estate, unto my beloved Sister Ann Flynn and her two Children and Archibald Watson Junior to be equally divided to their proper use. Item I appoint my Loving Wife Mary Watson and my Brother Archibald Watson Executors of this my last Will and Testament after my decease, Revoking and Annulling all other Will or Wills, and this only to be taken for my last Will & Testament, In witness my hand and seal this Twenty sixth day of August 1759.

I Benjamin McKinnie of Craven County, in the Province of South Carolina being Sick and Weak in Body but of perfect mind and memory, blessed be Almighty God for the same, and calling to mind the uncertainty of this life, and knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die, Do make and constitute this my Last Will & Testament as follows. First I commend my Soul to God; my Maker, and Bequeath my Body to the Earth, to be buried in a Christian like decent manner, as my Executors herein after named shall direct; And next as touching such Worldly Goods, as God has blessed me with, I bequeath them in the following manner, Viz. I give and bequeath unto my beloved Wife Mary McKinnie a Tract of Land containing Two hundred Acres in Craven County aforesaid, which was granted to William Goff, adjoining William Boykins Land, and also I give to my said Wife one Negro Man, named Aldare, and one Negro Wench named Moll, and six Cows and six Yearlings, and four steers, Two of the Plow horses, and a young Natural pacing Roan grey Stallion, and half the household goods; Next I give and Bequeath unto my Daughter Lamindor Kirkland one Shilling Sterling, Next I give and Bequeath, unto my Children Archibald McKinnie, Elizabeth Kirkland Sarah Mackey, Penelope McKinnie, John McKinnie, Mary McKinnie, Fanny McKinnie, Christian McKinnie, Samuel McKinnie, Michael McKinnie and Priscilla McKinnie, all the Rest and Residue of my Worldly Goods and Chattels after my just debts are Discharged, Desiring that the same may be equally divided amongst my said Eleven Children last named, And it is my Will, That the Plantation whereon I now live shall be sold and the price of it be equally divided among my said last mentioned Eleven Children; And I do hereby constitute & appoint my

Principally, being truly penitent, for all my sins, and Trusting for Pardon and Remission of them, and to obtain Eternal life, and Salvation, in and thro' the prevailing merits and Mediation of Jesus Christ my Blessed Savior and Redeemer, I recommend my immortal Soul to God who gave it, and my Body at death I commit to the Grave to be interred in a decent and Christian-like manner, at the Discretion of my Executors and Executors herein afternamed, in hopes of a glorious Resurrection, And as to my Worldly Estate, Goods, Chattels, Lands, and Tenements, after my just Debts and funeral Expences, are paid, which I will and Desire may be first paid, I give, Bequeath, Devise and Dispose of the same and every part thereof in manner and form herein after respectively mentioned that is to say. First, I give and bequeath unto my Son in Law Thomas Hudson, the Sum of Five pounds current money of this Province, in lieu of any Claim or Right he may have unto my Estate. Item, I give and bequeath unto my Grand Daughter Mary Hudson the like Sum of Five pounds current money of this Province in lieu of any Claim or Right she may have unto my Estate. Item I leave, give, Bequeath, and Devise unto my Executors and Executors herein afternamed & their Successors Executors of this my last Will and Testament, for ever, the six following Negroes by name, London, Judea, Dinah, with her child London, Abraham and Jerry, with all my stock of Horses and cattle together with all my household Furniture, (excepting what shall be hereafter given and Devise'd) upon the special Trust and Confidence, Nevertheless, and to be for the several use

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
