this my Last will and Testament dated this nineteenth day of July in the
Year of our Lord 1748.

paid her by my Exe^cutors as soon as conveniently can be after all
funeral Charges are paid of and satisfied Item I Give to my say^d ^{personal}
Wife Jane Beard Three negroes (that is to say) a wench named Len

offspring Issue and Increase to hold to her her heirs and Assigns for ever and
Desire my Executors will permit and Suffer my Wench named Hannah to wa
upon my Wife during her Widowhood Item I give to my Brother George
Beard One Negro Wench named Quasabaw to hold to him his heirs and
Assigns for ever and also One Bed Bolster and Pillow and all my Waring
Apparell Except my Gold Watch Item I give to my Sister Margaret Beard
One Bed Bolster and Pillow Item my will and Desire is that my Cousin Mat
thew Beard be maintained Educated and brought up by my Executors and the
Charge thereof paid out of my Estate untill Such time as he shall be thought
of age convenient to be placed forth Apprentice which I also desire my Executors
or the Survivors and Survivor of them to do to Such Trade as they shall in
their Discretion think fit, Item my Will is that all my Stock of Meat &
Cattell and horses wheresoever they come be found be either kept Entire Sold
off in part or in Whole as my Executors hereafter named shall Judge most
for the Advantage of my Said Estate Item I do Order and direct that
my Executors and the Survivors and Survivor of them after the crop
of this Present Year One Thousand Seven Hundred and fifty Eight is
made and got in do bargain for sell and dispose of all my Real Estate
of what Nature or kind Soever or wheresoever the same may be to such
Person or Persons and at such Price or Prices as they in their Discretion
shall think fit and out of the Moneys arising from such Sale in the
first place to pay and discharge all my Just debts and Funeral Charges
and the overplus (if any there be) I desire may be placed out at Interest
On good Personal Security for the Benefit of my wife Jane Beard
And my Daughter Mary Beard Item I give and Bequeath all the
Remainder of my House hold Furniture to my said wife and daughter
Item I give and Bequeath my Gold Watch to my daughter Mary but my
Will is that my said wife Jane have the use of it till my said Daughter
arrives at the age of Sixteen years or day of Marriage which shall
first happen Item I give and Bequeath to my Brother in Law Morgan
Sells my Silver mounted Pistols Item all the Residue and Remainder
of my Estate I desire my Executors and the Survivors and Survivor of them
will remove to the Colony of Georgia as I think it will be most for the
Advantage of my said wife and daughter One third of which Residue
and remainder I give and devise and Bequeath to my said Wife
Jane Beard and to her heirs and Assigns absolutely for ever And the
other two thirds I give devise and Bequeath to my said Daughter
Mary Beard and to her heirs and Assigns but in case my said Daugh
ter should dye before she attains the age of Sixteen years without issue
Lawfully begotten then I do give and bequeath the said Two thirds
of the Residue and Remainder of my Estate to my said Wife Jane Beard
my Brother George Beard my Sister Margaret Beard and my Nephew
Matthew and George Beard sons of my Brother Matthew Beard to be
