In the name of God Amen I William Shrubsole of the Parish of George^t in the County of Middlesex Gentlemen being of a sound and disposing mind and Memory do make this my Last Will and Testament in manner and form following that is to say Imprimis I Will that all my debts and Funeral Expences be paid and discharged by my Executrix herein after named Item I give unto my long wife Elizabeth Shrubsole all my Goods and Chattels Money or what else I may dye possessed off and Lastly in case my said Wife Elizabeth Shrubsole should die before she return again to England (she now being abroad with me) then I will and bequeath what I may be possessed of to go to and be possessed of by John Jamieson Josiah Woodward Martha Jamieson and Ann Johnson all in the County of Chester my Brothers and Sisters in Law all my worldly effects what ever I may dye possessed off that is today share and share alike and to be equally divided among them Lastly I do make Constitute Elizabeth Shrubsole my said Wife Executrix to this my last will and Testament dated this nineteenth day of July in the year of our Lord 1748.

In the name of God Amen I James Baird of Santee in the Province of South Carolina Planter being sick and weak in body but of sound and perfect mind and memory (blessed be god therefore) do This twenty third day of April in the year of our Lord One thousand seven hundred and fifty eight and in the thirty year of the Reign of our Sovereign Lord King George the second make and Publish this my last will and Testament in manner and forme following that is to say (Imprimis I commend my Soul into the hands of almighty god who gave it me and my body to the earth from whence it came insure and certain hopes of a Joyfull Resurrection through the Merits of my Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ And as for that worldly Estate wherewithal it hath pleased god to furnish me I desirous thereof as followeth First I will that all my just debts and Funeral charges be paid by my Executors as soon as conveniently can be after my decease Item I give to my executors wife Jane Baird three negroes (that is to say) a wench named Ben

offspring Issue and Increase to hold to her, her heirs and Assigns for ever and
desire my Executors will permit and suffer my Wench named Hannah to be
upon my Wife during her Widownhood Item I give to my Brother George
Beard One Negro Wench named Quasabaw to hold to him his heirs and
Assign for ever and also One Bed Bolster and Pillow and all my Wearing
Apparele Except my Gold Watch Item I give to my Sister Margaret Beard
One Bed Bolster and Pillow Item my will and desire is that my Cousin Mat-
hew Beard be maintained Educated and brought up by my Executors and the
charge thereof paid out of my Estate until such time as he shall be thought
of age convenient to be placed forth Apprentice which I also desire my executors
or the Survivor or Survivor of them to do to such Trade as they shall in
their discretion think fit Item my Will is that all my Stock of Meat &
Cattell and horses wheresover the same be found be either kept Entred Sold
off in Harbor in Whole as my Executors hereafter named Shall Judge most
for the advantage of my Said Estate Item I do Order and direct that
my Executors and the Survivor and Survivor of them after the crop
of this Present Year One Thousand Seven Hundred and fifty Eight is
made and got in do Bargain for sell and dispose of all my Real Estate
of what Nature or kind soever or wheresover the same may be to such
Person or Persons and at such Price or Prices as they in their discretion
shall think fit and out of the Moneys arising from such Sale in the
first place to pay and discharge all my just debts and Funeral Charges
and the overplus (if any there be) I desire may be placed out at Interest
On good Personal Security for the Benefit of my wife Jane Beard
and my Daughter Mary Beard Item I give and bequeath all the
Remainder of my Household Furniture to my said wife and daughter
Item I give and bequeath my Gold Watch to my daughter Harry but
will is that my said wife Jane have the use of it till my said Daughter
arrives at the age of Sixteen Years or day of Marriage which shall
first happen Item I give and Bequeath to my Brother in Law Morgan
Sibley my Silver mounted Pistole Item all the Residue and Remainder
of my Estate I desire my Executors and the Survivor and Survivor of them
will remove to the Colony of Georgia as I think it will be most for the
advantage of my said wife and Daughter One third of which Residue
and remainder I give and devise and Bequeath to my said wife
Jane Beard and to her heirs and Assigns absolutely for ever and the
Other two thirds I give devise and Bequeath to my said Daughter
Mary Beard and to her heirs and Assigns but in case my said Daughter
should die before she attains the age of Sixteen years without issue
lawfully begotten then I do give and bequeath the said Two Thirds
and ^{the} Legate of the Residue and Remainder of my Estate to my said wife Jane Beard
Held in my Brother George Beard my Sister Margaret Beard and my Nephew
my last nephew and George Beard Sons of my Brother Matthew Beard to be
