wearing Apparell Household, Furniture or Others whatsoever to me at
the time of my Decease belonging or in any wise Appertaining together
with all and every Sum or sums of Money Debts and Books of Accounts
bonds, Bills, Notes, And Specialties to me due and Recoverable at the
time of my Decease as aforesaid Hereby Constituting the said John Goldin
sole and Only Executor of this my Last will and Testament, Revoking
all other and former Wills and Testaments by me heretofore made And
Given and declaring this to be my only Last will and Testament My
Witness Whereof I have hereunto Set my hand and Seal this fifth
day of February In the Thirtieth Second Year of his Majesties Reign And
in the year of our Lord One thousand Seven hundred and fifty nine

and declared by the Testator in his Life
