and Merchandizes whatsoever and wheresoever due Owning or
to me and all and singular my Personal Estate of what kind or
soever except one decent and compleat suit of Mourning robes
may be sent purchased and given to my daughter Amelia Wife
Secraft And I do hereby make and Ordain Constitutions
my trusty friends Col^l Nathaniel Barnwell Mr John Barnes
Mr John Chapman Executors of this my last Will and Testament
requesting that they speedily settle all my Affairs, and dispose
of my effects as are perishable, and the Monies arising there
any other way out of my Estate, they Apply to the Maintenance
for Children Richard and Mary, but it is my Will that no part
be paid or given to my son Richard or applied otherwise than just
untilt he be of duellage, nor to my daughter Mary untilt she be
or Married with the consent and Approbation of my said Executors
