In the name of God amen. I Joseph Pickering of Charlestown man
being weak in body, but blessed be god of sound memory, Do by these presents make
and declare, my last will and Testament in manner and form following. Principally
I command my soul into the hands of almighty God, hoping for a blessed immor
tality through the merits of my Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ, My Body I
committ to the Earth, And as for all my worldly Estate I dispose of the same in
manner following that is to say, First in case my loving Wife Ann shall sur
vive me, I give and bequeath unto Jacob Motte Senior of Charlestown his Exec
utors and Administrators In trust, for and to the use of my said Wife, her Executors
Administrators and Assigns, the sum of One thousand pounds sterling, or the
value thereof in current money of this province, as a full equivalent for all the share
and portion of the Estate of Ann le Brafleur the Mother of my said Wife, which
in Right of my said Wife I have received out of the said Estate, but this bequest
of one thousand pounds sterling as aforesaid for payment whereof, I do hereby
charge all my Estate, real and personal, as by me given Expressly upon the
following conditions and not otherwise, That is to say, upon condition that the
said Legacy of one thousand pounds sterling be received accepted and taken by the
said Jacob Motte and my said Wife, their Executors, Administrators and Assigns as
a full performance of all the Covenants and agreements on my part to be perform
which are contained in certain articles made before Marriage with my said
wife bearing date the tenth day of January in the Year of our Lord one thousand
seven hundred and Fifty, and made between me and the Reverend Alexander
Garden, since deceased and the said Jacob Motte, And also upon condition that the
said Legacy of one thousand pounds sterling, together with such other part of my
Estate as herein after is bequeathed to my said Wife to be taken and Accepted by
her, in full recompence and Satisfaction for all Dower and Right or Title of
Dower, which she can or may claim and demands into or out of all or any

224. part of my Estate real or personal. - Item I further give & bequeath unto my said Wife Ann, the use of these Slaves named Molly & her Dau^r Amy, Sarah and her Daughter Nancy, and a Negro man named Peter for and during the term of her natural life; Item I give to my said Wife, and her Executors, Administrators and Assigns, All that any Pew in the Church of Saint Phillips, which is occupied by Mr. Logan. Also I give unto my said Wife and Loving Mother Martha, the joint use of my other Pew in the said Church, during their lives, and after their deaths then to the use of my children. Item I do hereby direct my Executors to sell to the best advantage my two Negroes named George and Simon, and it is my will that the proceeds of the sale shall become part of my residuary Estate, to be disposed of as is herein after mentioned. Item all my Lands and Tenements and other my real Estate whatever I give and devise unto my three Daughters Mary Pickering, Ann Pickering, and Elizabeth Pickering their Heirs and Assigns for ever. Item in case of the death of my wife during our Absence from Carolina, I give and bequeath to my Loving Mother all my stock of wine, Rum & other Liquor. Item all the rest and Residue of my Estate real and personal, I do hereby give Devise and bequeath unto my three Daughters Mary Pickering, Ann Pickering and Elizabeth Pickering, together with such Child or Children, wherewith my wife may be now pregnant, to be equally divided between them share and share alike, and to their Heirs Executors and Administrators for ever, and in case any of my said Children shall happen to die before they respectively attain the Age of Twenty one years or Day of their Marriage Then it is my will that the Share or portion of such Child or Children so dying shall subsist and go over to the Survivor or Survivor of them, her his or their Heirs, Executors, Administrators and Assigns for ever. But if all my said Children shall happen to Die before age or Marriage as aforesaid, Then out of my said Residuary Estate, I give & bequeath unto my loving Mother the sum of One thousand Pounds curr^t money of South Carolina. Item to the South Carolina Society the sum of One hundred pounds current money, and the Remainder & Reversion of all my said Estate, I give Devise and Bequeath (in such manner) to and amongst the several Children of my Brothers Michael and John in equal division and their Heirs, Executors, Administrators and Assigns respectively; And I do hereby constitute and Appoint the said Jacob Motte and George Ingles and Henry Perronneau of Charlestown Merchants Executors of this my last Will & Testament, and Guardians of the Persons and Estates of all my said Children, hereby Bewoking and Dulying

In the name of God amen. I David Heat of Colleton County in
the Province of South Carolina being well in body and of perfect mind and memory
thanks be to Almighty God; But calling to mind the Mortality of my body, and knowing
that it is appointed for all men once to die. Do ordain this to be my last Will and
Testament. That is to say, principally and chiefly, I recommend my soul unto the
hands of God who gave it, and my body I recommend to the Earth, to be buried
in a decent Christian Burial, at the discretion of my Executors, nothing doubting
but at the general Resurrection I shall receive the same again, by the mighty
power of God. — And as touching such worldly Estate, wherewithal it hath pleased
God to Bless me, in this life; I give, demise and Dispose of the same in the following
manner and form. First, I give and Bequeath to Jane my Wife, the sum of
Ten pounds of Lawfull money of the Province aforesaid to be paid out of my Estate
Item I give and bequeath unto my loving Son John Hept, one Negro man named
Scar, one Negro man named Robin, and one Negro woman named Nanny.
Item I give and bequeath unto my beloved daughter, whom I call by the name
Rebecca Heat, the three Negroes following, namely one Negro man named
Abraham, one Negro woman named Ursus & one Negro woman named Dinah,
to her and her heirs forever. Item I give and bequeath between my beloved
Son John Hept, and my Daughter Rebecca Hept, a stock of cattle Branded
R. S. to be equally divided between them; Item I give to my well beloved
Daughter Ann Hept, the thirteen following Negroes namely, Aaron, Lucy, Mark,
Morish, Mass, Young Hagah, old Hagah, Sam, Will Dick, old Isaac, Moses, Young
Isaac, to her and her heirs forever. Item I also give Devise and Bequeath
to my well beloved Son, William Hept, the twelve following negroes, namely one
Negro man Buff, Tom Hopsham, Gomer, Troom, one Negro woman Peggy, one
Negro woman Daphney, one Negro boy Charles, one Negro boy Symus, one Negro
girl
