mind and Memory Praised be to God for the same do make this my last
Will and Testament in manner and form following that is to say
first and principally I commend my Soul into the hands of Almighty God
my Creator hoping through the Merits of Jesus Christ to Obtain Pardon
and Remission for all my Sins and to Inherit everlasting life, and my
Body I commit to the Earth to be buried in a decent manner at the discretion
of my Executors and Executors hereafter named And unto the Worldly Goods
and Temporal Estate wherewith it hath pleased God to bless me with in
this life I give and dispose thereof as followeth. Imprimis I do first appoint
that all my Just debts and funeral Expences to be paid out of the Produce
of my Plantation and that all my Estate of what kind so ever be kept
together upon my Plantation untill the Debts be paid and discharged with
The Produce of the same in manner aforesaid Item I give and Bequeath
unto my Loving Wife Elizabeth Smith One Mustee Wench named Cater with
all her future Increase and all my Stock of Cattle Horses Hogg & Household
Furniture to her my said Wife her heirs and assigns forever Item I give &
bequeath unto my said Loving Wife Elizabeth Smith and unto my
five Children to wit Walter Smith Arthur Smith Sarah Smith Nathan
Smith and Philip Smith all my Negroes to be equally divided among
them share and share alike to them their heirs and assigns for ever
the said Negroes to be divided in manner aforesaid when my Executors
shall think proper and my said children to be schooled & educated
and maintained as well as the Income of the Estate will admit or allow of
And lastly I do hereby Nominate constitute and appoint my said Wife
Elizabeth Smith Executrix and my brother Thomas Riden Smith one
of this my last Will and Testament hereby revoking disannulling annulling
Void all other Wills Bequests and Legacies by me at any time heretofore
made bequeathed or given and do make and declare this only to be my last Will
and Testament In Witness whereof I the Testator Nathan Smith have to
this my last Will and Testament set my hand & affixed my seal the 20th
day of November in the year of our Lord One thousand seven hundred and
forty five.

Do make and Ordain this my last Will and Testament in manner
following: First and principally I command my Soul into the hands
of God hoping through his Mercy and the Merits & mediation of
Saviour Jesus Christ to have full and free Pardon of all my Sins &
eternal life my Body I commit to the Earth to be decently buried at
the discretion of my Executrix hereafter Named and touching such Temporal
Estate as it hath pleased God to bless me with I give and dispose thereof
with Imprimis I give devise and bequeath unto my beloved Wife
the use of the dwelling house wherein I now live on my Plantation
on the North Side of Santee River during the Term of her Widowhood and no
Item I give devise and bequeath unto my Son James Buchanan
my said Wife Deborah during her Widowhood as a part the use of all
the remaining part of my Plantation to be occupied by them in
and during the Widowhood of my said Wife and upon the death or
the death of my said Wife which shall first happen then my Will is and
I do give devise and bequeath the said Plantation together with all
things and Appurtenances from and immediately after the death
of my said Wife unto my said Son James Buchanan and to
his heirs for ever Provided nevertheless that if my said Son James
shall happen to dye unmarried and under the age of Twenty and one years
in such case my Will is and I do hereby give devise & Bequeath
the said Plantation together with all the Buildings & Appurtenances
unto my Son John Buchanan and to his heirs and assigns for ever Subject
nevertheless to the Devise of the use thereof to my said Wife as above
I give devise and bequeath unto my Son Alexander Buchanan
his heirs for ever my Plantation commonly called Peccates Pond
about one hundred Acres of Land or thereabout Provided nevertheless that
if my said Son Alexander shall happen to dye unmarried and under the
age of Twenty years then and in such case my Will is and I do
give devise and bequeath the said Plantation called Peccates
unto my said Son John Buchanan and to his heirs for ever Item I give
bequeath unto my said Wife Deborah her choice out of all the Negroes
I have or shall have of to be delivered unto her immediately after my
death my Will is and I do hereby Order and direct that my debts
and be discharged by my Executrix herein after named as soon as
possible and my Estate shall be kept together and that the sum of Two
hundred Pounds current Money shall be raised out of the Profits and
