

40. the Remainder or Remainders of any Debt or Debt due by him to me and also hereby Direct my Executor then to Give him full and ample Titles unto the said Lands, usually called by the Name of Gibbons Land and after my Just Debts and funeral Expenses are fully paid hereby give and bequeath in Trust unto John Holmes for the use of his son Paddy Holmes untill he arrives at the age of Twenty one years all the Rest and Residue of my Estate Real and Personal of what kind or Nature whatsoever and in case of the Demise of the said Paddy Holmes before he arrives at the said age then unto his Brother Thomas Holmes and in case of his Death before the said age then unto John Boon Holmes all sons of the said John Holmes to them and their heirs forever. And lastly I do hereby Nominate constitute and appoint John Holmes of Christ Church Parish in Borthley County my whole and sole Executor of this my last Will and Testament & hereby Revoking and making Void all former and other wills by me at any time heretofore made and Declaring this only to be my last Will and Testament contained in this Sheet of Paper In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my Name with my left hand as also my seal being deprived of the use of my Right hand this thirtieth day of November in the Twentieth year of her Majesty's Reign Annoque Domini 1755.

In the Name of God Amen, the sixth Day of September in the year of our Lord God one thousand seven hundred and Fifty three I Thomas Miles Junr. of the Parish of St. Paul in the County of Colleton Planter being very Sick and weak in body but of perfect mind and Memory than be given unto God therefore calling unto mind the Mortality of my Body and knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die Do make and Ordain this my last Will and Testament that is to say Principle and first of all I give and Recommend my Soul into the hands of God that gave it: And my Body I recommend to the Earth to be buried in Decent Christian Burial at the Discretion of my Executors not doubting but at the General Resurrection I shall receive the same again by the mighty Power of God. And as touching such worldly Estate wherewith it hath pleased Almighty God to bless me in this life after my Just Debts and Funeral Charges are Paid I give Demise and Dispose of the same in the following manner and form, I give and bequeath unto my two well beloved Daughters Elizabeth and Mary Miles all that my Plantation or Tract of Land whereto I now live containing three hundred Acres more or less to be Equally Divided between them and to their heirs and assigns for ever.

 unto my dear and wellbeloved daughter Sarah Weatherly one hundred
 Pounds Currency, Item I give and bequeath to my three Grand Children
 Isaac Weatherly Sarah Weatherly & William Weatherly fifty £.
 Currency to each to be paid one year after my decease Item I
 give and bequeath unto my dear & wellbeloved daughter Eliza
 Arnold the use of all the remainder part of my Estate Consist
 of Negroes Cattle Sheep Horses Hogs and household furniture
 her Natural life, and at her decease to the heirs Lawful, beg
 of her body and in case she should die without an issue
 then it is my Will and Pleasure that my Estate as afore
 be Equally divided between my daughter Sarah Weatherly
 and my Son in Law William Arnold I likewise constitute
 make and Ordain Mr. John Cole and my Son in Law William A.
 Executors to this my last Will and Testament and do hereby ut
 disallow Revoke and disannull all and every other former Testa
 Wills Legacies Bequeaths and Executors by me anywise before
 Named Willed and bequeathed Ratting and confirming this an
 other to be my last Will and Testament In Witness whereof I have
 my hand and Seal this Twenty Eighth day of April in the Year of o
 Lord One thousand seven hundred and fifty seven

 the Last mentioned Children one Horse or Gelding of the best
 of my stock running up Still Creek I give to my friend George
 Vachman and his Wife one hundred pounds
