

Said wife & the said Robert Philp & James Parsons, Guardians of the Person & Estates of my son Thomas & daughter Sarah until they shall respectively arrive at their full ages of Twenty One Years my Daughter Mary having informed since the making of my said will with the said Robert Philp and I do hereby declare that since the making of my said will I have given to the said Robert Philp in part Portion towards the Advancement of my daughter Mary some of the Slaves by name given her by my said Will which it is my will shall be considered as a Recompence to her for the said Slaves, and I do hereby ratify & Confirm all & every the Gifts Devises Bequeaths in aid by my said will made & given not here by altered or otherwise determined, and do hereby declare this Writing to be a Codicil to my said will & it is my desire that the same be accepted & taken as part thereof as fully & Effectually to all Intent & Purposes as if the same had been actually inserted therein, All Witnesses whereof the said James Hartley have hereunto set my hand & seal this Twenty seventh day of June in the year of our Lord One Thousand seven hundred & fifty eight.

This Writing was signed & sealed by the above mentioned James Hartley & by him published & declared as a Codicil to be annexed to his last will & Testament in the presence of us who have hereunto subscribed our Names as clerks thereof in his presence

South Carolina, In the name of God Amen, I William Donaldson Minister of the Gospel at Kingston in the Parish of Annee George being weak in body but of sound memory, do make publish and declare the substance of my last will and Testament, in manner and form following the first day Principally, I commended my soul to Almighty God Hoping for the Mercy of my sins and a blessed Immortality thro the mediation of my Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ And as for my worldly Estate, I have and dispose of the same in the following manner, I Impriimes, It is my will that at a convenient ^{time} after the Reading & Im gathering of my Present Confession now recited, My Executors herein after named, do and shall dispose of and sell to the best Advantage all and singular my Estate both real and personal, And I do hereby Authorize and empower them and the survivors of them their Heirs Executors and Administrators, to make Execute and deliver good and sufficient Titles for the same, and every part thereof to the purchasers or purchasers, and to the end that my Estate may be sold, to the best advantage, I desire my Executors if possible to obtain the consent of my Creditors that the same be sold for one Years Credit from the day of sale and not for ready money. - Item it is my will that the moneys arising from the sale of my said Estate be applied by my Executors, First

206 in payment of all my just and lawfull debts, and afterwards in satisfaction of my Legacies herein after bequeathed. - Item I give and bequeath to my Executors and the Survivor of them their Heirs Administrators and assigns the sum of One Hundred pounds current money of South Carolina in trust to be applied by them, towards raising and augmenting a fund for supporting and maintaining a minister of the Gospel and Member of the presbyterian Church of Christ, on that part of the province called Britons Neck - Item I give and bequeath to William Glen junior son of William Glen one of my Executors herein after named, the sum of One hundred pounds current money aforesaid, and all and singular the Test and Residue of my said Estate, I give devise and bequeathly unto the Reverend Mr William Dun, of Kellyleagh, near Down Patrick, Minister of the Gospel, and to all and singular my Brothers and Sisters or the Representatives of such of them who may be dead (per stirpis) equally to be divided amongst them share and share alike. And I do hereby direct and empower my Executors to remitt the Residue of my said Estate, as expeditiously as they conveniently can, to the hands of the said William Dun, to be by him distributed and divided between himself and my said Brothers or Sisters or their Children in equal portions as aforesaid. Finally I do hereby constitute and Appoint William Glen of Charlestown Merchant, and George Skinner of Maccamaw Planter, Executors of this my last Will and Testament. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and Seal this 28 day of February anno Domini 1759.
