day of June in the year of our Lord one thousand seven
hundred and Eighty four I Matthew McMartin of Prince
George Parish Parson in Queen's County in the Province
of South Carolina planten being weak in Body but of
sound mind and memory Thanks be given unto God
for the same therefore calling to mind the mortality of
my Body do make and ordain this my last Will and
Testament First and Principally I give and Recommend
my soul into the hands of God who gave it
and my body to the Earth to be buried in a decent manner
at the discretion of my Executors, and as touching such
worldly Estate wherewith it hath pleased God to Bless
me in this life I give devise and dispose of the same
in manner and form following In witness whereof I will and
desire that all my just debts be paid as soon as may
be after my decease Item I will and desire that ~~my~~
my Executors hereafter named do sell at publick sale
my Tract of land situate in St James's Parish Lower
Coast containing about Two hundred acres all my
Slaves now in my actual possession my stock of Cattle

Cattle Horses Household Furniture and all other my personal
Estate whatsoever and whosoever. Immediately or as soon
as they conveniently may after my decease. Item I give and
bequeath unto my good daughter Elizabeth Davies daughter
of David Davies of Santee Two hundred pounds Currency
to be put to Interest for her sole and only use and to the use
of her Heirs after her decease. Item I give and bequeath unto
my friend John Smith of Robeson two hundred pounds
Currency to his own proper use benefit and behoof and in
case of his decease to the use of his Heirs Item I give and
bequeath unto my friend David Dugan of new-town Marsh
One hundred pounds Currency to his own proper use and
behoof and in case of his decease to the use of his Heirs. Item
I give and bequeath unto William Davies, who now lives
with me at Rice Nepe, one hundred pounds Currency (Believe
of his yearly wages) to his own proper use and benefit and
to his Heirs at his decease) Item I give and bequeath unto
Jane Davies daughter of David Davies fifty pounds Curr.
to her proper use and to the use of her Heirs at her decease
Item I give and bequeath fifty pounds Currency which
is to be paid to John Smith and William Mathews and deposited
in their hands and disposed of by them to the use of the
Meeting and Congregation near to peccote Ferry on Santee
River as the said John Smith and William Mathews shall
see most convenient. Item after the above legacies are paid
off and discharged by my Executors, my will and desire is
that all the residue or Remainder of my Estate arising from the
above sale be put to Interest which together with the Interest I give
and bequeath unto my Son and beloved Nephew Alexander Paterson
of Myrach in the parish of Kirkcaldie in the shire of Falloway in
North Britain and to his Heirs forever. And to my well beloved
Brother

Brother Patrick Mc Masters son of William Mc Masters of
Kildonon in the above parish of Kilmalduagh and shire of
Down and to his heirs forever to be Equally divided, let each
them share and share alike and in Case of their or either of
their decease, then to their or either of their heirs forever
And Lastly to this my last Will and Testament I
Constitute and appoint my Esteemed Friends Robert Hume
and John Smith my Executors of this my last will and
Testament And I do hereby utterly revoke and disannul
all former Testaments Wills legacies and Executors by me
before named killed and Bequeathed Ratifying and Confirming
this and no other to be my last will and Testament
In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and
Seal the day and year which above written

The Twenty eighth day of January in the year of our Lord one
Thousand seven hundred and sixty four, I Nathay Cleave of
St Thomas Parish Berkeley County in the Province of South Carolina
Carpenter being weak and sick in body but of a perfect mind
Memory and understanding Thanks be given to God therefore calling
to mind the mortality of my body and knowing that it is appointed
for all men once to die, do make and ordain this my last will and
Testament

Testament That is to say I give and principally of all I give
and recommend my soul into the hands of almighty God who gave
it and do hope and trust through the merits of my saviour Jesus
Christ to receive full pardon for all my sins and to inherit eternal
life for his sake and my body I recommend to the Earth to be buried
in a Christian like manner at the discretion of my Executors nothing
doubting but at the General Resurrection I shall receive the same
again by the mighty power of God and as touching such worldly
wealth wherewith it hath pleased God to bless me with in this life
I give demise and dispose of the same in the following manner and
form Inprimis I give and Bequeath unto my loving wife Catherine
one bed and furniture one dressing table one dressing glass
one silver watch one horse and saddle, and all the silver plate
belonging to my Estate to her and heirs forever. Then I give and
Bequeath unto my loving friend Joseph Sanders all my wearing
apparel and my arms with one gold Ring the Policy of which is
thus, You see, Remember me. Then I give and Bequeath unto
my Brother in law Thomas Martin Sanders all my Books of
Architecture with the Instruments belonging to them and also my work-
ing tools and one mourning ring to him and his heirs forever
Then I give Sixty pounds to purchase a grave stone for me and
to make the wall wherein my former wife is buried longer. Then
It is my further Will that all the remainder of my Estate both real
and Personal be sold at a public Vendue and the monies arising
from the same (after my lawful debts are paid) be divided into three
Equal parts one part of which I give and Bequeath unto my said
loving wife Catherine to her and her heirs forever. Then the other
two parts which is the remainder of my Estate I give and Bequeath
unto my child or children, if any lawfully begotten of me and born
of my said wife Catherine the child or children parts or parts to be
put out to Interest until they arrive to the age of Twenty one years
by the day of their marriage. Then I care I have no children
I then give and Bequeath the whole three parts aforesaid to
my said wife Catherine to her and her heirs forever. Hereby
nominating constituting and appointing my well and truly beloved
Wife aforesaid whole and sole Executrix of this my said last will
and Testament
