

In the name of God Amen the Eighteen of January one thousand seven hundred & twenty I Andrew Walser of Pittsburgh Planter being very sick and conscious of my perfect mind & memory thanks be given unto God therefore calling unto mind the uncertainty of my Body & knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die do make & ordain this my last Will & Testament that is to say principally & first of all I give & bequeath my soul unto the hands of Almighty God that gave it and my Body I recommend to the Earth to be buried in Christian Burial at the direction of my Executors nothing doubting that at the General Resurrection I shall receive the same again by the mighty power of God, and as touching such worldly estate wherewith it has pleased God to bless me in this life I give & bequeath and assign of the same in the following manner I give I ordain a tract of land containing six hundred & fifty acres to be sold for to pay the debts. The land lies in the township of Pittsburgh Southward joining Mr Henry Chapelle's land also given to my son John Walser the plantation near the town of Pittsburgh containing one hundred acres of Land. and also I ordain that my dear Beloved Wife Barbara Walser shall live and enjoy the said plantation during her lifetime also to have the half of all my moveables between her & my two small sons named Michael & Gabriel Walser & in case she marries again her half of all moveables shall be divided in three parts in order that the two Boys shall have their part of these moveables equal one as the other of the half of all the moveables and the other half part of all moveables is for my son John Walser whom I likewise constitute make and ordain my Executor with John Cook Executors of this my last Will and Testament all in Execution my last by him freely to be approved & signed and Enjoined and I do hereby utterly disavow Revoke and Rescind all & every other former Testament Wills Legacies Bequests and Executors by me any way or by me named willed & Bequeathed Intending and Confirming this and no other to be my last Will & Testament in Witness Whereof I have hereunto set my hand & seal the day & year above written Signed Sealed Published pronounced & declared by the said Andrew Walser in his last Will & Testament in the presence of these Witnesses

In the name of God Amen I Thomas Haile of Berkeley County in South Carolina Planter being weak of Body but of a sound memory and judgment thanks be for all his mercies, and not knowing when it may please God to take me out of this World have made & declared this to be my last Will & Testament in the manner I follow that is to say principally & first of all I Recommend my soul unto the hands of Almighty God that gave it and my Body to the Earth to be interred in a Decent Christian manner at the direction of my Executors hereafter appointed and as touching such Worldly Estate wherewith it has pleased God to bless me with I give & bequeath as followeth viz^t First I do leave & Bequeath to my well Beloved Wife Mary Haile a negro French named Martha or a negro fellow named Surjent, which she chooses as also twenty five pounds South Currency to a young Bay mare named Molly as also twenty five pounds to buy a suit of Hounings and of the said Mary should prove with child before my death that the child shall be entitled to an equal Division
