South-Carolina,

In the Name of God.

Amen, I Archar Smith of Berkeley County in the Province of South Carolina, being now through the mercy of God of sound mind & memory do make publish and Declare this my last Will and Testament this fourth day of October in the Year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and sixty, And hereby revoke, annul and make void all former & other wills and Testaments by me heretofore made or declared; And as to my worldly Estate I will and desire that the same and every part of it may go and be disposed of in the manner and form hereinafter respectively mentioned, and no otherwise, First I order all my just debts and funeral Charges shall be paid and Discharged, as soon as possible after my decease. Item I give and bequeath unto my son George Smith my negro man called Bermuda Sam, also my negro boy called Tony which is now in his Possession and my Silver Coffee pot, I also give & devise to my said son George Smith his Acre and Acrens for ever all & singular my Plantations, Buildings and Lands with the appurtenances thereto belonging situate on Caffer River & Goose Creek, with this restriction that if my Loving wife Elizabeth Smith chooses to Live on said Plantation, she may have the use of Two Rooms and a Closet also of Tary & Kitchen during her continuing my widow and no longer; Item I give and bequeath unto my Daughter Sarah Naring two Negro men, namely Cuffy & Charles now under the care of her husband, also Thirteen Hundred pounds current money of this Province and a Silver Tankard & Silver Souinger each marked SL; Item I give and bequeath unto my Daughter Susanna Naring two negro men named Sampson & Dick (lately under her deceased Husband's care but now under hers, also my Fair negroes named, severally Andress, Sue, Rose & Dede, as also a mulatto Girl named Flora to serve her for the space of ten years, at the expiration of which time she shall have her freedom; Item I give and bequeath to my son ^{George} Daniel Smith Thirteen Hundred pounds current money of this Province (and a Silver Tankard, and Silver Souinger) Item I give and bequeath to my son Daniel Smith Thirteen Hundred pounds current money of this Province. Item I give and bequeath unto my son Archar Smith my six negroes now under his care, named Comber, Delinda, Prince, Cumber and her two Children Phillis & Dick; Item I give and bequeath unto my Grand Daughter Sarah Smith Daughter of my son George Smith and Elizabeth his wife, my Negro Girl called Cather, Item I give and bequeath to my Grand Daughter Mary Naring Daughter of Benjamin Naring & Sarah his wife my Negro Girl named Glee; Item I give and bequeath to my Grand Daughter Mary Naring, Daughter of Susanna Naring, my Daughter, my negro woman called Jenny with her increase.

one Hundred pounds sterling. Item I give and bequeath unto my loving wife Elizabeth Smith, all the Negroes, with their Increase which I had by her, and was in my possession after marriage, as also every thing else of what kind soever, which she was possessed of at the time of marriage. I also give unto my said loving wife Elizabeth Smith Thirteen hundred pounds current money of this Province, also my Riding Chair and a Horse called Dagon, as also Ten Cows and my best bed and Furniture, &c. &c. the rest and residue of my estate whosoever and whatsoever I give bequeath and devise the same, and every part and parcel thereof to be divided, by my Executors hereinafter named, by them or the survivor of them to be allotted into two equal parts or shares, and by them or the survivor of them to be allotted and bequeathed and paid over to my Daughter Susannah having one Half, the other Half to my son Archar Smith. And I do now appoint my sons George Smith and Archar Smith to be Executors of this my last Will and Testament. In Witness whereof I the s^d Archar Smith have hereunto set my hand & seal the day & year first above written, Archar Smith E.D.

In the name of God Amen I James MacLaughling of Charles Town Neck in the Parish of St. Philips and County of South Carolina Planter being of advanced age but of sound perfect mind memory and understanding, joined in God for the same; I have for calling unto mind the mortality of my Body, and knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die, To make and ordain this my last Will and Testament, That is to say, principally and first of all, I give and Recommend my Soul unto the hands of God that giveth it, and my Body I recommend to the Earth to be buried in Decent Christian burial at the Discretion of my Executors, nothing doubting but at the General Resurrection, I shall receive the same again by the mighty Power of God, And as touching such worldly Estate, wherein it hath pleased God to bless me in this life, I give devise and Dispose of the same in the following manner and form, First, I give and bequeath unto my son in law John Stewart the sum of Ten pounds current money of the Province aforesaid to be paid him out of my Estate, by my Executors hereinafter named. I give and bequeath unto my Grandson James Stewart the sum of one thousand pounds current money of the said Province, the one moiety of the said Thousand pounds to be paid to him at the end of one year after my decease, and the other moiety at the expiration of one full year after the first payment. I give and bequeath unto my Grand Son John Stewart the sum of one Thousand pounds like current money aforesaid the one moiety to be paid unto him when he arrives to the age of Twenty & one years, and the other moiety at the expiration of one year after the first payment, And in case it so happen that either of my above named Grand Sons die before he be of the age of twenty one years, That then his part is to the survivor, and if it so happen that they both die before they are of the aforesaid age, that then both of their Parts is to go & be equally divided between by son William and my other three Grand Children hereinafter named. I give and bequeath unto my Grand son William Roulain, the sum of one Thousand pounds like money aforesaid, the one moiety to be paid unto him when he is of the age of Twenty one years, and the other moiety at the end of one year after the first payment; I give and bequeath unto my Grand son Daniel Roulain the sum of one Thousand pounds currency aforesaid to be paid unto him the one moiety when he arrives at the age of twenty one years, and the other moiety at the expiration of one year after such first payment. I give and bequeath to my Grand Daughter Catherine Carle Roulain, the sum of one Thousand Pounds of like money, to be paid unto her when she shall be of the age of Twenty one years or day of Marriage, one moiety of the s^d Thousand Pounds, and the other moiety at the end of one year after such first payment; But in case she marry a man that is not of the age of Twenty one years, that then she is not to receive any part of the said sum, until he be of the aforesaid age of twenty one years. I likewise give to my said Grand Daughter Catherine one French Ring and Bedstead, one Bolster, two Pillows, one Pair of Blankets, one pair
