In the Name of God, amen I Edmund Erby of Craven County in the Province of South Carolina being this the abundant Mercy and Goodness of God Tho' weak in body yet of a sound and perfect Understanding do constitute this my last will and Testament and desire it may be received by all as such. Inprimis I most humbly bequeath my soul to God my maker beseeching his most gracious acceptance of it through the all sufficient merits and mediation of my most compassionate Redeemer Jesus Christ. Inprimis I give my body to the Earth from whence it was taken in full assurance of its resurrection from thence at the last day, as for my burial I desire that it may be decent at the discretion of my Executors hereafter named As to my worldly estate I will and positively order that all my debts be paid. Item I will that my eldest son Charles have his freedom from the time of my departure out of this mortal state and I also give & bequeath unto the said Charles all the wooden furniture which shall be found in my house after my decease together with three iron pots Two Horses and Equal part of the Cattle with the rest of my children. I assign all my wearing Cloaths. Item I give to my Daughter Elizabeth the Bed which belonged to her sister one mare & ride saddle with the Furniture cover. Item I give to my son Edmund one Feather Bed & its Furniture and an Equal part of the Cattle. Item I give to my Daughter Rebecca one Feather Bed & its Furniture. Item I give to my son Robert one Feather bed & its Furniture with an equal part of the Cattle. Item I will that my negro fellow be sold to pay what debts I have contracted, and the money's remaining after the Pay<sup>t</sup>.
