Imprimis I commend my soul unto Almighty God who gave it me, and my Body to the Earth from whence it came in hopes of a joyful resurrection through the merits of my Saviour Jesus Christ, And as for that Movable Estate wherewith it hath pleased God to bless me I dispose thereof as followeth First I give to my beloved wife Mary Stereus my Riding Chace and Horse called Honey
Item I give my whole Personal Estate to be equally divided betwixt my said wife Mary Stereus and my five Children (viz) William Stereus, David Stereus, Joseph Stereus, Elizabeth Stereus and Mary Stereus all my just debts being first fully paid & answered.
Item I give to my beloved sons William Stereus and David Stereus one tract of land containing five hundred acres lying upon a Swamp called Good Land Swamp, to be equally divided betwixt them. Item I give to my beloved son Joseph Stereus one tract of land containing one hundred Acres joining to the aforesaid tract of land.

Nearly I do hereby constitute, ordain & appoint my beloved Wife Mary Sterens my loving Brother Jacob Sterens, and my good friend Robert Mackewon to be my whole & sole Executors & Executors of this my last Will and Testament.
