By the will of God It Whereas I Edward Brown of the County and Province aforesaid do find myself in a very low & weak Condition by the present affliction the Lord has been pleased to visit me with and though in a very low Condition Thanks be to God I now find myself in my right mind & proper senses which opportunity I now take to make my last Will & Testament which I desire to be as followeth. First that I should be decently buried according to the Christian form, I give & bequeath all my lands to Gabriel Clements of above said County and province and all the remaining part of my Estate both goods & Chattels in all places or parts for divers good causes & considerations I do will give & bequeath unto Rebecca Thomas & to her two daughters viz. Wrepley & Marget Clements to be equally divided among them and in Consideration of the good opinion

opinion and confidence I put in my two friends John Pearson & Michel Meier both of Orange County & Province aforesaid I appointed them both as Executors to execute this according to my desire above mentioned which is my will & Testament signed with my hand & seal this 15th day of April in the year of our Lord 1762 and in the second year of His Majesty's Reign

In the name of God amen I Daniel Hunt of the parish of St Philip in the Province aforesaid being of a sound & disposing mind memory and understanding and considering the certainty of death and the uncertainty of the time thereof do in order to settle my temporal affairs, make my last will and Testament in manner & form following that is to say first and principally I humbly recommend my immortal soul to my great Creator hoping by the merits of my blessed saviour to obtain remission of all my sins and an happy admission into the Regions of Bliss and Immortality and my Body I desire may be decently but very frugally interred at the discretion of my Executor hereafter named and as to such worldly estate & Effects whatsoever hath pleased God to bless me I give devise & Bequeath the same in manner and form following that is to say first I will order and direct that all my just debts and funeral expenses be paid off and discharged as soon as conveniently may be after my decease, Item I give & bequeath all the rest residue & remainder of my estate and effects whatsoever the same may consist on or wheresoever the same may be or the proceeds thereof unto my trusty and well beloved friend William Hopton of Ansonborough in the parish of St Philip aforesaid Gentlemen upon Special Trust & Confidence nevertheless that he do and shall well & truly pay and apply all the Interest, Rent, profit & increase thereof or of the proceeds thereof during the natural life of my well beloved friend Sarah the wife of the said William Hopton unto her the said Sarah Hopton for her own sole & separate use and advantage exclusive of her present or any future husband she may intermarry with and no ways subject to the debts, dues or duties of any such husband or husbands and at the decease of her the said Sarah the present wife of the said William Hopton or at my decease in case I survive her I give devise and Bequeath all such Rest, Residue & Remainder of my Estate and Effects or the proceeds thereof to and among all the children of the said Sarah Hopton by the said William Hopton that shall be living at such time to be equally divided between them share & share alike and

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
