 personal the same to enjoy during the time she continues my  
 Widow, except what shall herein be hereafter excepted but I she  
 the said time should marry she is to enjoy only the thirds of my  
 said Estate Also I give and bequeath to my grandsons John James  
 the son of Francis James one negroe boy named Henry and to the  
 girls sisters of said John James one hundred and twenty pounds  
 to each sister to be paid to them by the Executors, or one young negroe  
 if they, or any of them, so chuse, likewise I give and bequeath to my  
 son Sherwood James one negroe man named Dick and one Mollato  
 man named Nanny and her increase and also fifty  
 acres of land lying near the Swamp, held and Surveyed by a  
 County warrant, likewise I give and bequeath to my son John  
 James one negroe man named Mille and her increase and  
 also one negroe man named Tony also my Smiths tools and  
 still and an eagle negroe and in case Kate said the half of said  
 still is to be my son Sherwoods likewise I give and bequeath to  
 my only daughter Mary Seagleton one Mollatto girl named  
 Rucy and one negroe boy named Robin together with Rucy's increase  
 likewise I give to my daughter Mary one negroe girl  
 named Mille, likewise I give and bequeath to my son John  
 all the lands which I possess together with all buildings and  
 improvements thereon except that before mentioned to my son  
 Sherwood, likewise I do further will and ordain that all the  
 Negroes I have now or yet will be to be divided Equally amongst  
 my three children Sherwood, John and Mary, as they  
 can agree amongst themselves, but if they cannot agree in dividing  
 said negroes then they are to be sold at publick auction and  
 The money
