In the Name of God amen I Hugh Anderson of Charles Town
in the Province of South Carolina Carpenter being much indisposed in body
but of sound mind memory and understanding do now make, publish and
declare this to be & contain my last Will & Testament I commend my soul to
God my Creator, my body I desire may be decently interred at the discretion
of my Executors and Executors hereinafter named: humbly hoping for a glorious resur-
rection to eternal life through the merits & mediation of my blessed saviour Jesus
Christ and the worldly estate which Almighty God of his bounty & favour
has bestowed upon me after all singular my just debts & funeral charges
are fully & ultimately paid & satisfied I give devise & bequeath in manner & form
following that is to say Inprimis I give & devise unto my son Hugh Anderson
my house & land on the north side of Queen street in Charles Town
in the province aforesaid which I purchased of Andrew Rutledge wherein
I now live together with the hereditaments & appurtenances thereto belonging
& also my negro fellow named Joe, To hold the same unto my said son
Hugh Anderson & his heirs & assigns forever, reserving nevertheless unto my
dearly beloved wife Ann Anderson & her assigns the use & occupation of my
said house & land & the appurtenances until my said son Hugh Anderson
do & shall attain the age of sixteen years, if she the said Ann be remain & continue
my widow. Item I give & devise unto my son James Anderson my house & land
situate on the West side of Church street in Charles Town as aforesaid which
I purchased of David Maybank, together with the hereditaments & appur-
tenances thereto belonging & also my negro man named Jasper to hold
the same unto my said son James Anderson & his heirs & assigns forever
Reserving nevertheless the yearly Rents Issues & income of the said House land &
appurtenances on the West side of Church street aforesaid for & towards
the maintenance & support of my said wife Ann & the support and
maintenance & education of my Children & family until my said
son James attains the said age of sixteen years. Item for and
towards the further support & maintenance of my said wife

him & the support maintenance & education of my said children & family
 I do likewise reserve & appropriate the yearly rents & issues & incomes of
 my other house & land & appurtenances situate on the east side of Union
 Street in Charles Town aforesaid which I purchased of the Executors of Geo:
 West deceased, until my said son Hugh Anderson attains the age of
 fifteen as aforesaid and upon my said son Hugh his attaining the said
 age I do hereby give & devise the said house and land & appurtenances
 unto my said wife Ann Anderson & her assigns for & during the term
 of her natural life if she doth continue so long my widow, & on the decease
 of my said wife Ann or marriage, which shall first happen, I do here
 by fully empower & direct my Executrix & Executors hereinafter named or
 such of them as shall take upon her him or them the execution of this
 my will & the survivors or survivor of them & the Executors or administrators
 of such survivor, to grant bargain & sell my said house & land & appurtenances
 on the East side of Union Street aforesaid at public Vendue
 for the most money that can be gotten therefor & to make & execute such
 Deeds & Conveyances as may be necessary for conveying & assuring the same
 unto the purchaser or purchasers thereof his her or their heirs & assigns forever
 And the money arising from such sale, if my said wife Ann should happen
 to marry again I order & appoint to be divided into four equal parts
 one part whereof I give & bequeath unto my said wife Ann one other
 part whereof unto my daughter Ann Anderson the younger One other part
 whereof unto my daughter Jane Anderson & the remaining part unto
 my daughter Rachael Anderson but if my said wife Ann should
 remain & continue my widow until her decease then I do order & further
 appoint the money arising from the sale of the said house & land &
 appurtenances on the East side of Union Street as aforesaid to be
 divided into three equal parts; one third part whereof I give & bequeath unto
 my said daughter Ann Anderson the younger; one third part whereof
 unto my said daughter Jane Anderson and the remaining one third
 part whereof unto my said daughter Rachael Anderson Item I give
 & bequeath unto my said dearly beloved wife Ann Anderson my two
 Negro wenches named Venus & Flora & their future issue & increase to
 hold the same unto my said wife Ann & her assigns forever I also give &
 bequeath unto her my said wife Ann, my pew in the South Gallery in the
 parish Church of St. Philip in Charles Town aforesaid, likewise my Negro
 Man named Will to hold the said Pew & the said Negro man Will
 unto my said wife Ann & her assigns during the term of her natural

life & at her decease I do hereby give & dispose thereof to such persons & persons & in
 each manner & form as is hereinafter mentioned of & concerning the same that is to
 say as for & concerning the same that is to say as for & concerning the said year in the
 Parish Church aforesaid on the decease of my said wife Ann Gordon & direct my
 said Executors or some of them to sell & dispose thereof at publick Vendue & the
 money arising from such sale I do hereby give & bequeath unto & among my three
 Daughters Ann Anderson the Younger, Jane Anderson & Rachael Anderson to be
 equally shared & divided between them share & share alike. Item I give & bequeath
 unto my said Daughter the said Ann Anderson the Younger, my negro man named
 Bella with her future Issue & Increase & also the sum of Three Hundred
 Pounds of Lawful current money of the province aforesaid to be laid out & applied
 by my said Executors & Executors or some of them in the purchase of a Negro, for the
 use & benefit of her my said Daughter Ann: To hold the same unto my said
 Daughter Ann & her assigns forever. Item I give & bequeath unto my said
 Daughter Jane Anderson, my Negro man named Rose, & her child Bob & also my
 Negro boy named Prince, with the future issue & Increase of the said Negro Rose To
 hold the same unto her my said Daughter Jane Anderson & her assigns forever. Item
 I give & bequeath unto my said Daughter Rachael Anderson, my negro man named
 Gilgia and her child Baby with her future Issue & Children: And also the sum
 of Two Hundred Pounds current money aforesaid to be laid out & applied by my
 said Executors & Executors or some of them in the purchase of a Negro for the use
 & benefit of her my said Daughter Rachael: To hold the same unto my said
 Daughter Rachael & her assigns forever. Item I give & bequeath unto my said beloved
 Wife Ann Anderson all & singular my household goods & implements of household
 Plate & household & Kitchen Furniture, of every species & denomination; To hold
 the same unto my said wife Ann & her assigns absolutely forever. Provided
 my said wife Ann, remain & continue my widow during her life; But if my said
 Wife Ann should marry again Then it is my Will & I do hereby give & bequeath
 the same & every part thereof unto her my said wife Ann & my children, the
 above named Ann Anderson the Younger, Jane Anderson, Rachael Anderson
 Hugh Anderson & James Anderson, to be equally divided ^{between} them in the
 most equitable & impartial manner by my said Executors & Executors or such
 of them as do qualify & take upon them her or them the burden of this my
 Will and the Survivors or Survivor of them or the Executors or Admors of such
 survivor. Item it is my will that suitable mourning be provided by my said Executors
 for herself & my children out of my Estate. Item all the rest & residue of my Estate
 Real & personal whatsoever & wheresoever I do hereby give devise & bequeath
 unto my said beloved Wife Ann And my children the above named Ann

 & James Partell of the Province aforesaid Planter Executors of this my last
 Will & Testament hereby to all intents and purposes revoking & making
 void all former & other wills by me at any time heretofore made & declaring
 this only to be my last Will and Testament contained on this and the three
 preceding pages of one sheet of Post Paper. In Witness whereof I the said
 Hugh Anderson have to this my last Will and Testament set my hand & Seal
 this fifteenth day of February in the third year of his Majesty's Reign Anno
 Domini One thousand seven hundred & sixty three

In the Name of God amen. I John Caunon of the County of Curanew
 in the Province of South Carolina Planter being of sound & perfect memory &
 calling to mind the uncertainty of life & knowing that it is appointed for all men
 once to die do make & ordain this my last Will & Testament in manner & form following
 (viz^t) I first recommend my soul into the hands of almighty God who gave it me
 & my body to the earth to be buried in a Christian like manner at the discretion
 of my Executors hereafter named & as for my worldly Goods which God of his great
 mercy hath endowed me with I dispose of them in the following manner (viz^t)
 It is my will & desire that all my just debts be paid Item I give & bequeath
 unto my son Samuel Caunon five shillings sterling Money of Great Britain
 Item I give & bequeath unto my Daughter Mary Penington wife of Jacob
 Penington five shillings sterling Money of Great Britain Item I give and
 bequeath to my Daughter Agness Smith wife of George Smith five shillings
 sterling money of Great Britain. And further It is my Will & desire to leave to
 my Son Ephraim Caunon part of a tract of Land lying on the West side of the
 meadow Branch belonging formerly to Christopher White And further It is
 my will & desire to leave to Deborah Detrymple wife to John Detrymple
 a two year old gray mare And further it is my will & desire to leave
 to my Son James Caunon my home place that I now live on and
