Part of my Interest consisting of Negroe Slaves &c to my aforesaid
Child Mary Booth Ferguson and after her death I give & bequeath
all unto my loving Husband Thomas Ferguson Lastly I Constitute
Nominate and appoint my loving Husband Tho^s Ferguson to be
Executor of this my last Will and Testament. Witness my hand
and Seal this 6th Day of February 1760.

Leonard Nimman of Granville County Planter being very sick and
weak in body but of perfect mind and memory Thanks be given
to God for the same And calling to mind the mortality of my body
and knowing that it is appointed for all men once to Die Do make
and Ordain this my last Will and Testament That is to say. Princi-
pally and first of all I give and recommend my soul into the hands
of God that gave it and for my Body I recommend it to the Earth
to be buried in a Christian like decent manner at the Discretion
of my Executors Nothing doubting but at the General Resurrection
I shall receive the same again by the mighty power of God
And as touching such worldly Estate where with it hath pleased

and Bequeath unto Anney Thomson one Feather Bed and a Pair
of Blankets now in my Possession
