 in the whole eight hundred and eight acres shall be the
 property and inheritance of my grandson John Cato Field
 his heirs and assigns forever, to my son in law William
 Knight I give devise and bequeath one negro woman named
 Hagan with her issue and increase to him during life and
 after her death then to the children of my daughter Elizabeth
 Knight deceased and their assigns, to my dear and well beloved
 son William Field I give devise and bequeath these three
 mentioned places, Negro, Little Chlog, and Indist this my
 will and desire and I do hereby authorize and empower
 my Executor hereafter named to sell and dispose of my lands
 following that is to say one tract of land lying near
 M^r Hutchinsons and M^r Ball's plantation also two Islands
 on Swarts River in Granville County known by the name of
 Pecky and Jacobs Islands the monies hereupon arising to be
 employed in payment of my just debts, and also it is my will
 and I do hereby authorize and empower my said Executors
 to sell and dispose of such of my cattle sheep and horses as
 are not mentioned in this my will the money arising from
 such sale to be aiding in the payment of my just debts, and
 the overplus to be divided equally divided between my Grand
 children Elizabeth Nicholls Rezia Field Mary Scott and
 John Cato Field and in order the better to secure the property
 of those several slaves to my said wife Mary Field during
 her life and to my daughter Jennet Smith during hers
 and after to her children Charles and Elizabeth and their
 heirs which are mentioned in a deed executed by me this
 day I do hereby declare that it is my will that the said
 slaves as are therein mentioned shall be held as is therein
 specified and I do also confirm and secure the property
 of those slaves to my daughter Jennet Smith which are
 mentioned in another deed executed by me at same time
 in manner as is therein mentioned by declaring that it is my
 will that the said slaves shall be held by my said daughter
 Jennet in in manner therein specified references to the
 two several deeds being had will more fully appear. I give devise
 & bequeath

and bequeath unto my dear and well beloved son William Field
 these several mentioned Buckambo Alora, Lolo's Jack, Venture
 Leipsom Nanny Sabina and Roxanna with their future issue
 and increase to him and his heirs forever and lastly I constitute
 and appoint my said son William Field Executor to this my last
 will and testament hereby revoking and disannulling all former and
 other wills heretofore by me made. In witness whereof I have hereunto
