And in case the said Mary Newman shall be married to Capt. Percy Gordon of his majestys first Regiment of Foot I do will & bequeath two thirds of my said Estate unto the before named Edward Southam. And it is my desire that my Sister Mary shall Depart for England with all convenient speed. And Lastly I do beconstrute & Appoint Charles Dixon of London Merchant & Robt. Smyth and Thomas Shirley both of Charlestown South Carolina Executors of this my last Will & Testament hereby revoking & making void all former Wills. ### South Carolina

Crown County In the Name of God Amen. The fourteenth of March one thousand seven hundred & sixty one years & in the first year of his Majestys reign I James McCollard being very weak & weak of Body but of perfect mind & memory blessed by God. Calling to mind the mortallity of my Body do make this my last Will & Testament that is to say principally & first I leave my soul to God who gave it my Body I recommend to the Earth. My worldly Estates to give & bequeath & dispose of in the following manner & for Imprimis I will & Appoint to Mary my beloved wife my Hertling House and on third part of this tract of land I now live on adjoining said House during her life & thenceforth to revert together with the whole tract to my son James. Notwithstanding if my wife shall chuse to move off to Georgia Government with the family I will & appoint this my tract of land to be sold & the monies arising therefrom to be a part of my personal Estate Item I will & bequeath to my son James a tract of Land in Georgia Province now laid out to me containing three hundred & fifty acres that the grant of said Lands may come out in his name to him & his heirs I appoint likewise that one other tract of land containing four hundred acres in Georgia Province the grant thereof to come out in my wifes name to her & her heirs forever Item I will & appoint the payment of all my lawful & just debts & general charges Item I will & bequeath to Mary my beloved wife one third part of my whole personal Estate the other two remaining thirds I give and bequeath to my own children that is to James, John, Leonard, Bruce, Samuel, and Grizall in the following manner that is to James a proper share when at maturity of all other of my children their shares to remain in my wife hands until each of them arrives at maturity & then each of them to

so, previous their proper share, but if their mother death or marriage should happen before such time, that then each of them respective shares shall be put into the hands of my Executrix after named, allowing nevertheless my children power to claim for themselves guardianship if they shall have none and if any of my children die before they arrive at Maturity without Lawful Heir that then their respective share or shares shall revert to the surviving equally. I do likewise make constitute and appoint my wife Mary Executrix my son James widow of Agg, and David L. Henney Executor of this my last will & testament Ratifying & confirming this, no other to be my last will & I do hereby revoke disallow and Disannul all & every other wills legacies & bequests by me in any wise manner before this day & witness Whereof I have hereunto set my Hand & seal the day & year above written.

Proved my Hand before the use of the Publick rodice at a hundred & twenty four pounds. A note of hand of John Astrough Craven County twenty pounds. Item I give Mary Kelly twenty pounds Item the remainder part to be divided between Thomas Colyer item Mary Kelly Item William McCollough 2nd & appoint Elizabeth McCollough & Thomas Colyer Executors of this my last will & Testament In witness whereof I have set my hand, and this Eleventh day of May in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred & sixty one
