 Lincoln being in good Health of body and of sound mind & memory and
 being forthwith to depart on a voyage to the Island of Jamaica do make this
 my last Will and Testament as follows. First I give & bequeath to my
 Brother William Asline the sum of twenty five pounds also I give and
 bequeath to my sister Thomas Dally wife of Thomas Dally to her sole
 use and behoof the sum of twenty ~~pounds~~ pounds, and with which the said
 Thomas Dally shall not intermeddle or have anything to do, also when
 the above sums of money & legacies or what may hereinafter follow are
 fully paid & discharged, I give & bequeath to my Brother Robert
 Asline Ann Asline & Jane Asline my sisters all other my substance
 and property whatsoever & wheresoever it may be & be found whithen
 in money Bills, Bonds, Book debts, Goods, Chattels &c. or of not ever
 kind or nature ~~it~~ it may consist of & be, to be jointly & equally divided
 amongst them my said Brother Robert Asline & my sisters Ann & Jane
 Aslines: And I likewise make constitute & ordain Mr. John Davies of the
 City of Lincoln and Thomas Marshall of Hether Hall near Doncaster my
 Sole Executors of this my last Will & Testament and I also (after all
 reasonable charges and expences being first paid and allowed, which
 they the said John Davies and Thomas Marshall or either of them may
 be at by collecting & gathering my effects & substance together, I give
 and bequeath to the said John Davies and Thomas Marshall the sum
 of Two pounds ten shillings each to requite them for their trouble in the
 Execution of this my will and I also give and bequeath unto the said Tho:
 Marshall the further sum of Five pounds and also my will and mind
 is that all the above said sums of money and legacies or whatever my
 effects may consist of be paid & divided as aforesaid so soon as they
 can be got together And further in case the said William Asline
 or any person or persons to whom any legacy or benefit out of from
 or by reason of this my will shall commence any suits or suits in any
 Court of Law or Equity or other court whatsoever or by any ways or
 means sue or disturb or cause to be sued or disturbed my Exors or
 Trustees herein named then my will and meaning is that all & every of
 the legacy or legacies herein by me given to the said William Asline
 or any of them so owing my said Exors in the due Execution of this my
 will shall cease determine & be utterly void, and that then & from
 thenceforth I do give & bequeath all & every the legacy & legacies which I
 had in this my will given to such person or persons unto such of my
 said brother Robert Asline my sisters Ann & Jane Asline as shall not
 sue or in any wise interrupt my said Executors in the due Execution of
 this my will In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand
 & seal this 18th Day of June in the year of our Lord 1754 John Asline (L.S.)

Dean General & Official Principal of the Right Reverend Father in
God, John by divine permission Lord Bishop of Lincoln lawfully constituted
make known to all men that upon the twenty second day of December
in the year of our Lord 1763, Before the Reverend Francis Howson
Bishop and lawful Surrogate, the Last Will & Testament of John Asline
late of the City & Diocese of Lincoln deceased but dying at Charles Town
in the Province of South Carolina in parts beyond the seas hereto annexed
was proved approved & registered, and admⁿ of all & singular, the Goods
Chattels Rights & Credits of the said deceased & any way concerning his
will lying & being in the City & Diocese of Lincoln was granted to John
Davies & Thomas Marshall joint Executors named in the said Will
they having been first duly sworn upon the Holy Evangelists well &
faithfully to administer the same & to make a true & perfect Inventory of all
& singular the said Goods Chattels & Credits and to exhibit the same into
the registry of the Consistory Court of Lincoln or before the next day of
March next ensuing and also to render a just & true acc^t thereof
seven under the seal of our office the Day & year above written -
