In the Name of God amen. I John Caunon of the County of Curawen
 in the Province of South Carolina Planter being of sound & perfect memory &
 calling to mind the uncertainty of life & knowing that it is appointed for all men
 once to die do make & ordain this my last Will & Testament in manner & form following
 (viz^t) I first recommend my soul into the hands of almighty God who gave it me
 & my body to the earth to be buried in a Christian like manner at the discretion
 of my Executors hereafter named & as for my worldly Goods which God of his great
 mercy hath endowed me with I dispose of them in the following manner (viz^t)
 It is my will & desire that all my just debts be paid Item I give & bequeath
 unto my son Samuel Caunon five shillings sterling Money of Great Britain
 Item I give & bequeath unto my Daughter Mary Penington wife of Jacob
 Penington five shillings sterling Money of Great Britain Item I give and
 bequeath to my Daughter Agness Smith wife of George Smith five shillings
 sterling money of Great Britain. And further It is my Will & desire to leave to
 my Son Ephraim Caunon part of a tract of Land lying on the West side of the
 meadow Branch belonging formerly to Christopher White And further It is
 my will & desire to leave to Deborah Detrymple wife to John Detrymple
 a two year old gray mare And further it is my will & desire to leave
 to my Son James Caunon my home place that I now live on and

Part of another tract that did belong to White & a third part of all the more-
able Estate, And Further the said James Caunon shall pay unto his sister
Margate the sum of one hundred pounds current money of said
Province & also the sum of One hundred pounds current money of said
Province to Rebecca his sister each when they come of age. And for this
it is my will & desire to give to Elizabeth McAluse wife to John McAluse two
Cows and also I do give fifty acres of land lying upon Ryth's Creek to
my daughter Rebecca & also a side saddle & also one feather bed &
furniture & also to my daughter Marget one bed & furniture & my saddle.
And I desire that my Son James Caunon may take care & dir's
for these girls ~~until~~ till they come of age. And I hereby appoint my son
Samuel Caunon & my Son Ephraim Caunon to be my whole & sole
Executors of this my last Will & Testament hereby disallowing & making
all other Wills by me heretofore made void & of none effect. In Witness
whereof I have hereunto set my hand & seal this fourth day of October One
Thousand Seven Hundred & Sixty two.

lish this my last Will & Testament in manner & form following (to wit)
Imprimis I commend my soul into the hands of Almighty God who gave it me &
my body to the Earth from whence it came in hopes of a joyful res-
urrection through the merits of my Lord & Saviour Jesus Christ & as far that
my worldly estate which it hath pleased almighty God of his mercy & goodness
to bestow upon me, & that I shall die possessed of intitled unto
or invested, or shall belong to me at my decease wheresoever or howsoever
in any manner of wise (the debts by me owing & my funeral expenses being
first thereof deducted & paid) I do give devise & bequeath the same &
every part & parcel thereof fully wholly & safely unto my beloved grandson
William Blamyer (son of John Blamyer of the province aforesaid Planten)
when he shall attain to the age of Twenty one Years to be by him & his
