sixty acres one other plantation or tract of land joining  
Northwardly thereto containing one hundred acres. One  
other plantation parcel or tract of land lying and joining  
with the aforesaid plantations or tracts of land containing  
one hundred and forty one acres to the Eastward of the aforesaid  
said tracts of land to my son William Eberson and his heirs  
forever all one hundred and one acres be it more or less  
Also I give and devise two plantations parcels or tracts  
of land containing six hundred and seventy acres that is to  
say one plantation parcel or tract of land situate and lying  
near the Horse shoe Barrenah adjoining to and butting  
and bounding to the Eastward and Southward of the lands  
hereinbefore devised to my son containing one hundred  
and seventy acres another other plantation parcel or tract  
of land containing five hundred acres adjoining thereto  
and lying Southwardly unto my daughters Mary Hardin  
and Sarah Eberson to them and the heirs of their bodies for  
ever that is to say the above six hundred and seventy acres  
of land I ordain that the same shall be equally divided  
between my two daughters Mary and Sarah. The greatest part  
of which tract to Mary and the heirs of her body forever  
and the Easternmost part of said tract to Sarah and the  
heirs of her body forever it being my intent meaning and  
desire that my estate real and personal remain undivided  
and so kept together by my executors until my debts  
are all paid and I hereby make and ordain my son  
William Eberson and my grandson William Hardin  
whole and sole executors of this my last will and Testament

around Cades Amanda March Prince and Cato Item I give to  
my son Langridge Clifford all my lands and tenements on the  
North side of Clifford street on white point and my house in King  
Street next to Charles Carter and my pasture near town and my plantation  
on the west side of Coopers Creek Road St Andrews Parish  
Berkeley County. Item I give to my son Eliza John Clifford all my  
lands and tenements on the South side of Clifford street on  
white point and my house in King street next to Samuel Wainswrights  
and joining that of Ben my son Langridge and the house I now live  
in after my wifes death and my plantation on the East side of Coopers  
Creek road St Andrews Parish Berkeley County. Item I give to my  
daughter Elizabeth Piggott to be enjoyed after my debts is paid the lots  
and Buildings in Cliffords Alley leading from King street to  
Archdale street the following lots as they are numbered in a plat or  
plan for the said alleys N<sup>o</sup> 5 N<sup>o</sup> 6 N<sup>o</sup> 7 N<sup>o</sup> 13 N<sup>o</sup> 14 N<sup>o</sup> 18 N<sup>o</sup> 19.  
Item I give to my daughter Elizabeth Clifford to be possessed after  
my debts ~~are~~ is paid the following lots and buildings in Cliffords

Item I give to my daughter Mary Clifford the lots and buildings in

in Clifford's Alley as they are numbered aforesaid No. 1, No. 2, No. 11,  
No. 24, No. 25, No. 26, No. 27. I give all my Negroes and all  
my personal Estate whatever to be equally divided amongst  
my children. Xmas must be kept to repair the buildings  
which must be shared. Afterwards the negroes given my wife  
and their increase after her death must be shared. Note all  
I have given my daughters is to them and the heirs of their bodies  
and for default of such heirs in return to the rest of my children  
or grand children then alive and if my daughter Ruthazza builds  
or improvements any of their lands and she die without an heir in as  
above so shall receive the rent till the return of thing that she  
described is paid. Lastly I nominate my good friends  
William Sandridge Greenton and my beloved wife Martha  
Clifford Greenton during her widowhood and no longer be the  
said Sandridge Greenton his life time To this my last will  
and Testament and I do hereby revoke and make void all  
former will whatsoever. In witness whereof I have set my hand  
and seal in the third year of his Majesty's Reign King  
George the Third and in the year of our Lord one thousand  
Seven hundred and sixty three being the 20<sup>th</sup> day of March

and increase during her life and then the said negro woman  
and her issue and increase to be for my grand daughter Joanna  
Dubose for her and her Heirs forever, and in case my Grand daughter  
Joanna Dubose should decease before the said Catherine  
my daughter then the said negro woman called Betty and her  
issue and increase to be for my said daughter Catherine other chil-  
dren that shall be born after this time and their Heirs forever. Item  
I give and bequeath unto my said daughter Catherine and to her  
Heirs forever a negro boy called Dennis and a girl called Mary  
and her issue and increase. Provided she pays the sum of one  
hundred pounds for the use of my estate. I give and bequeath unto  
my daughter Judith the sum of 100 hundred pounds being the  
sum due to me by Mr. John Coming Ball by his note of hand, and  
my Chest of drawers now at said hand. Item I give and bequeath  
to the children of my daughter Esther deceased by Mr. Peter Roberts  
to be paid to the said Peter Roberts you their use, the sum of three  
hundred pounds currency. Item I give and bequeath unto the children of my  
son David deceased the sum of two hundred pounds currency being  
already in their mothers hands as appears by her note of hand.  
Item I nominate and appoint Mr. John Coming Ball and Mr.  
Pence Dubose to be Executors of this my last will and Testament  
Resolving and unwilling all other wills or Testaments herebefore  
by me made and declared. In witness whereof to this my last  
Will and Testament I set my hand and seal this eleventh day
