

Mary and Sarah's part I give and bequeath to them and the heirs of their bodies forever. Also I give and devise three plantations parcels or tracts of land vizt all that my plantation or tract of land whereon I now dwell containing two hundred and twenty acres, one other plantation or tract of land joining Northwardly to that containing one hundred acres. One other plantation parcel or tract of land lying and joining both the aforesaid plantations or tracts of land containing one hundred and forty one acres to the Eastward of the aforesaid tracts of land to my son William Elcherson and his heirs forever all five hundred and one acres be it more or less. Also I give and devise two plantations parcels or tracts of land containing six hundred and seventy acres that is to say my plantation parcel or tract of land situate and lying near the Horse shoe, Saranah, adjoining to and butting and bounding to the Eastward and Southward of the lands heretofore devised to my son containing one hundred and seventy acres and another other plantation parcel or tract of land containing five hundred acres adjoining there to and lying Southwardly unto my daughters Mary Gardner and Sarah Platt unto them and the heirs of their bodies forever that is to say the above six hundred and seventy acres of land I ordain that the same shall be equally divided between my two daughters Mary and Sarah the greatermost part of which tract to Mary and the heirs of her body forever and the Easternmost part of said tract to Sarah and the heirs of her body forever it being my intent meaning and desire that my estate real and personal remain undivided and be kept together by my Executors untill my debts are all paid, and I hereby makes and ordains my son William Elcherson and my Grandson William Gardner whole and sole Executors of this my last will and Testament in witness whereof of the said Tho: Elcherson have to this my last will and Testament set my hand and seal the day and year above written.

my son Knaxbridge Clifford all my lands and tenements on the
North side of Cliffords street on White point and my house in King
street next to Charles Gardner and my pasture near town and my plantation
on the west side of Goosecreek Road St Andrews Parish
Berkeley County. Item I give to my son Eliza John Clifford all my
lands and tenements on the on the South side of Cliffords street on
White point and my house in King street next to Samuel Wainwright
and joining that given my son Knaxbridge and the house I now live
in after my wifes death and my plantation on the East side of Bone
Creek Road St Andrews Parish Berkeley County. Item I give to my
daughter S. Riggs to be enjoyed after my debts if said the lots
and buildings in Cliffords Alley leading from King street to
Archdale street the following lots as they are numbered in a plat on
plaw for the said alley. No 5. No 6. No 7. No 13. No 14. No 18. No 19.
Item I give to my daughter Elizabeth Clifford to be possessed after
my debts ~~is~~ is paid the following lot and buildings in Cliffords
alley aforesaid as they are numbered in the aforesaid plat No 8. No 9.
No 10. No 15. No 16. No 17. No 20. Item I give to my daughter
Frances Clifford the lots and buildings as they are numbered aforesaid
in Cliffords Alley. No 3. No 4. No 12. No 21. No 22. No 23. No 28.
Item I give to my daughter Mary Clifford the lots and buildings in

in Cliffords alley as they are numbered aforesaid No 1. No 2. No 11. No 24. No 25. No 26. No 27. I give all my Negroes and all my personal Estate whatever to be equally divided amongst my children. Xingos much be excepted to repay the buildings who must be shared. Afterwards the negroes given my wife and their Increase after her death must be shared. Note all I have given my daughters is to them and the heirs of their bodies and for default of such heirs it returns to the rest of my children or grand children then alive and if my daughters have had or build or improve any of their lands and she die without an heir as above the child receive the rent till the utmost farthing that he expended is paid. Nextly I nominate my good friends William Dandridge Esq. and my beloved wife Martha Clifford Esq. during her widowhood and no longer. To be the said Dandridge Esq. his life time To this my last will and Testament and I do hereby revoke and make void all former wills and Testaments. In witness whereof I have set my hand and seal in the third year of his Majestys Reign King George the third and in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and sixty three. being the 20th day of March

Dear redeemer Jesus Christ and as touching such worldly estate as it pleased God to bless me with I give and dispose thereof in manner following Viz^t I give and bequeath unto my daughter Catherine and her heirs all my wearing apparel, beds and furniture Riding chain and horses now in use and my press Item I give and bequeath unto my said daughter Catherine the use of a young negro woman called Kelly and her issue and Increase during her life and then the said negro woman and her issue and Increase to be given my grand daughter Joanna Dubois and her heirs forever, And in case my Grand daughter Joanna Dubois should decess before the said Catherine my daughter then the said negro woman called Kelly and her issue and Increase to be given my said daughter Catherine other child now that shall be then alive for them and their heirs forever. Item I give and bequeath unto my said daughter Catherine and to her heirs forever a negro boy called Jimmy and a girl called Mary and her issue and Increase. Provided she paye the sum of one hundred pounds for the use of my estate. I give and bequeath unto my daughter Judith the sum of four hundred pounds being the sum due to me by M^r John Coming Ball by his note of hand and my Chest of drawers now at said Ball. Item I give and bequeath unto the children of my daughter Catherine deceased by M^r Peter Robert to be paid to the said Peter Robert for their use, the sum of three hundred pounds currency. Item I give and bequeath unto the children of my son David deceased the sum of two hundred pounds currency being already in their mothers hands as appears by her note of hand. Item I nominate and appoint M^r John Coming Ball and M^r Isaac Dubois to be Executors of this my last will and Testament Revoking and annulling all other wills or Testaments heretofore by me made and declared.
