In the Name of God Amen I John McCullough of St Johns Parish in Colleton County & in the Province of South Carolina Planter being weak in Body but in sound & Perfect mind & memory Thanks to Almighty God for the same & Calling to mind the mortality of my Body & knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die, do make & ordain this my Last Will & Testament That is to say principally of first of all I Give & recommend my Soul into the hands of God. That I send & my Body to the Earth to be Buried in a Christian manner Nothing doubting at the General Resurrection I shall receive the same again by the mighty Power of God. and as Touching such Worldly Estate wherewith it hath pleased God to Bless me with in this Life I dispose of the same in the manner following *Wth*:
I desire that my Lawful Debts & funeral Charges be paid & the remainder as follows Item I Give unto my Well beloved Wife five pounds Current money of this Province in lieu of her Dowry. Item I Give unto my Son Heans McCullough one Shilling Sterling Item I Give unto my Son Andrew McCullough one Shilling Sterling Item I Give unto my Son John McCullough one Shilling Sterling Item I Give to my Daughter Mary Ingers one Shilling Sterling Item I Give unto my Son William McCullough my House & land on which I now Live & likewise all the remainder of my Personal Estate to him his Heirs forever But in case my Son William McCullough Should die before he should arrive at the age of Twenty one years or be married then in that case I do Give all my Estate Both Real & Personal which is not Disposed off to my beloved Wife Eliza McCullough to her heirs for ever & lastly I do hereby revoke all former Wills & Testaments made by me & I do hereby Acknowledge this & no other to be my Last Will & Testament to the which I do hereby constitute appoint & ordain my Beloved Wife Eliza McCullough Sole Executrix to this my Last Will & Testament In witness whereof I hereunto set my hand & Seal this Twenty third day of February In the Year of our Lord one Thousand Seven Hundred & fifty nine
