I Moses Audebert, the Testator above named do this twenty fifth of March in the year of our Lord Christ one thousand seven hundred and Sixty six make and publish this my Codicil to my last Will and Testament, and make Lyon the same, in manner following, that is to say, as to the five hundred pounds Sterling, by my said last Will and Testament Willed and directed to be transmitted to Hugh Britani, for the several uses and purposes therein mentioned, I do hereby declare that my will is that my Executors herein named, shall be at liberty either to transmit the said five hundred pounds Sterling money to be invested into Bank stock, or to lay out the same, to interest on good security in this Province, as they in their discretion shall see fit yearly and every year during the respective minorities, and for the lives & perhaps of my Brother, Salath Audeberts three sons Philip, Isaiah and M^r Beer, as therein is mentioned, anything before to the contrary notwithstanding. In the Name of God amen, I John Sanson Mingoood of the Parish of Christ Church in Berkeley County and Province of South Carolina being sick and weak in body but of perfect mind

and memory Thanks be to almighty God for the same and calling to mind the mortality of my body and knowing that it is appointed for all mankind once to die I do make and ordain this my last Will and Testament in manner and form as follows and first of all I recommend my soul into the hand of almighty God who gave it in hopes of a joyful resurrection and my body I recommend to the grave to be buried in a decent Christian Burial at the discretion of my Executors hereafter named, and now as to the settling of those my worldly goods that it hath pleased God to bestow on me I settle and bequeath as follows. I give and bequeath unto my beloved Wife Elizabeth Mingoood two negroes, Women Named Kate and Jane all the household Goods of that kind sover a Riding Chain and two Chain Hooses, also one Silver Watch Item I give and bequeath unto my beloved son John Mingoood two negroes boys named Abram and Jack. Item I give and bequeath unto my beloved daughter Sarah Mingoood two Negroe girls named Ring and Bess. Item I give and bequeath unto my beloved son John Mingoood all my lands and my wife to have a living on the said bequeathed Land during her life. Item I will that the remaining part of my negroes be sold if my Executors shall think proper, and the money arising from the sale of my Negroes sold, together with the money arising from the sale of my stock in general I will that it be Equally divided between my wife as aforesaid and my children, and I will that my children receive each their part of the said Estate at the age of twenty one years, and I will that their said monies shall be put to interest till then on good security but in case any one of my above named children should die before he or she comes to the above age of ones and twenty years that then such child's part shall be Equally divided between my loving wife aforesaid and the other surviving child, but in case both my children should die then I will that both such children's parts shall go to my Wife aforesaid during her natural life and at her decease each part as she possessed as came by the death of my said children shall be Equally divided between my beloved Mother Mary Barasale and my beloved Brother Charvil Mingoood. Lastly I nominate my beloved Brothers Charvil Mingoood and Nathan Regare as my Executors and my beloved Wife Elizabeth Mingoood as my

Executrix

Executing to this my Last Will and Testament Revoking and making void and null all other former Wills and deeds by me made or done Ratifying and Confirming this and none Else to be my Last Will and Testament In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and Affixed my seal this tenth day of March 1764.

In the Name of God amen I Hugh Maggarroch of St Pauls Parish Colleton County & Province of S^c Carolina Chosen being in good Health of Body & Sound mind & memory (Thanks to God) do this twelfth day of July and in the year of our Lord One thousand Seven hundred & sixty four make & ordain this my last Will and Testament in the manner & form following First in the most submissive manner I recommend my soul to almighty God hoping for pardon for all my past sins & iniquities through the merits of his only Son my blessed Lord Jesus Christ & mediation Jesus Christ Secondly my Body I commit to the earth to be decently buried at the discretion of my Exors hereafter named And thirdly for the settling of my Temporal Estate (my just Debts being first paid) I bequeath as follows Viz^t Item I give and bequeath unto James Broom in Wilmington in the Province of Pennsylvania Sixty pounds the said Pennsylvania Currency to him and his heirs & assigns forever Item I give & bequeath unto William Davis of the said Wilmington and Province of Pennsylvania the just sum of twelve pounds Ten Shillings Currency of the province aforesaid to him and his heirs & assigns forever Item I give & bequeath unto W^m Anderson & Francis Robertson of the said Province aforesaid the just sum of Forty pounds Currency

of the Province aforesaid to be equally divided between them & their heirs & assigns forever Item I give and bequeath unto Tho^s Hartman & Abraham in the County of near Castle on Ballaware River & Province aforesaid & Elizth Wells of Belfast in the County of Cumber and Kingdom of Ireland all the remainder of my Estate (if any after the above bequeaths) to be equally divided between the said Thomas Hartman and Elizabeth Wells to them & their heirs forever my will is also that my said Exors hereafter named at my decease should sell dispose of my negroes and other goods & effects as they think proper and the most for the good of the Estate either for Cash or Credit & I do hereby constitute & appoint as Executors to this my will and Testament my good friends Mess^{rs} John Midgell & John Trauger with full ample power & authority to Execute this my last Will & Testament & sell & dispose of the above premises & I do hereby revoke & disannul all former Wills & bequeaths & allow and confirm this to be my only last will and Testament In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal the day and year above written

Personally appeared John Mitchell of St Pauls Parish Planter who being duly sworn on the Holy Evangelists of almighty God, make & say that he doth renounce the Executorship of the within will as Executor & the Depoant further saith that he drew the within will by the directions & orders of the within named Hugh Maggarroch who declared that the Requests therein contained were and should be his last will and that he would Execute the same But the said Hugh Maggarroch afterwards died suddenly which prevented his signing & sealing the said will and that he the Depoant at the time of giving this Depoant the directions for drawing the within will was of sound mind memory & understanding John Mitchell At the same time qualified John Poague Executor of the within will sworn under my hand this Eighth day of May Anno Domⁱ 1765.
