Manter, being weak of body but of perfect mind & memory thanks do given do I do therefore calling to mind the mortality of my body & knowing it is appointed for all men once to die Do make & Ordain this my last Will & Testament that is to say principally & first of all I do Recommend my soul into the hands of God that has it and for my body I Recommend to the Earth to be buried in a Christian manner at the direction of my Executors nothing doubting but at the General Resurrection I shall receive the same again by the mighty power of God, and as touching such worldly Estate wherewith it hath pleased God to bless me with in this life I give Devise & Dispose of the same in the following manner & form. I Imprimo it is my will & I do order that all my my just debts & general charges be first paid. I then Give do son James Larock the sum of five pounds. Item it is my will that my Estate both real & personal do be sold & equally divided between my beloved wife Mary Larock, my son Benjamin Larock & my Daughter Ann Larock, & Abigail Larock, & that my Daughters share Ann Larock & Abigail should be put to Interest till they shall come to the age of Eighteen on the Day of Marriage in case either of them should die before that age or the Day of Marriage then their part to be divided between the survivors & my wife's Part after her Decease to be equally divided between my son Benjamin Larock & my Daughters Ann Larock & Abigail Larock. I discharge nominate constitute appoint & Ordain my beloved wife Mary Larock Executrix my son Benjamin Larock Executor to this my last will & Testament revoking & annulling all other & former Wills Legacies & Bequests the acknowledging this & no other to be my last Will & Testament as witness my hand & seal the day & year above Written.
