Secondly as to my worldly affairs, I give all that I am possessed of at present or shall hereafter have, any claim or title unto unto my beloved Wife Mary Stokes whom I appoint my Executrix during her life, and to her Children after her if she has any by me, my lawful debts being first paid but if she has none my will is that it hereafter shall be equally be divided Mary Stokes, Thos^s Stokes and Sarah Stokes, the Children of Joseph & Mary Stokes of Bristol my father & Mother in law.

In the name of God amen I Job Milner of Charles Town in the province of South Carolina Merchant being sick & weak in body but of sound disposing mind memory and understanding do make & publish this my Last Will and Testament in manner & form following That is to say, First I will that all my just debts & funeral Expences be duly paid & satisfied; Item I give devise & bequeath unto my Daughter Mary Milner & to her heirs & assigns forever, when and as she attains the age of eighteen years or day of marriage which may first happen. All that my dwelling house & ground to the same belonging situate on the East side of meeting street but in case she dye before that time then I give & devise & bequeath the said House and ground with all its appurtenances unto my loving wife Mary Milner and to her heirs & assigns forever. Item I will that my mother Ann Milner have a room in the said House, ready furnished and have the use of all my Negroes in Common with my wife & be decently supported and maintained during her life out of my estate And after my said Mothers decease I give and bequeath unto my said wife my negro man Dick a boatman, my negro man Mingo a Cooper, & Diobah a woman with her future issue and Increase Item I give & bequeath unto my said Daughter Mary my Negro Wench Sabina & her four children named Sam Colon Nelly & Bess with their Issue and Increase Item I give unto my Nephew John Colcock all my share right & Interest I have as a member of the Charles Town Library Society; Item I give unto John, Mary

Catherine and Elizabeth Colecock the sum of fifty pounds Curr. each I give unto Job Colecock two hundred Pounds Curr. & be paid them as they attain their respective ages. The males at Twenty one years, and the females at Eighteen years And all the residue of my Estate I give & bequeath the same to my said wife Mary her Executors Admors & Assignes forever Upon my decease I will that the negro wench named Delia be delivered to Catherine Colecock she being bought by me for her use. And I hereby nominate & appoint my said wife Mary Milner, Executrix, Maj^r George Raden Bond, John Rose & John Chapman Executors of this my last Will and Testament hereby revoking all other wills by me at any time heretofore made declaring this only to be my last Will & Testament. In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand & seal the thirty first day of December in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred & sixty two.

I give & bequeath to John Beswicke of London Merchant and his two Partners Mess^{rs} Greenwood & Higginson & the Survivors & survivor of them and the Executors & Administrators of each survivor all sums due to me or that I have a right & charge for commissions on and my labour & trouble in receiving and remitting the Estate and Produce of the Estate late of Alexander Perie of Charles Town merchant deceased in trust that they the said John Beswicke & Mess^{rs} Greenwood & Higginson or the survivors or survivor of them shall put out the same to interest for the use & benefit of Robert Perie a minor son of the said Alexander Perie & pay the same with the interest thereof to him the said Robert when he shall attain his age of twenty one years. I direct that my Executors hereinafter named or the survivors or survivor of them as soon as conveniently may be after my death shall put up & sell or cause to be put up and sold at Publick Auction or otherwise as they or the Survivors shall think proper & when in their discretion they shall think fit my half or right in & to the Ship union her tackle Furniture & Apparel and all the negroes belonging to the said John Beswicke & myself jointly in Partnership and also all other Estate & Effects that I shall have at the time of my death jointly or in Partnership with the said John Beswicke or any other Person. Also I give & bequeath to my dearly beloved Wife Ann McQueen forever all her own & my wearing Apparel one half of my Household goods Plate & Furniture in use in South Carolina my chair my Kitchens and three of my best chain Horses. Also during her life I give and bequeath to my said wife Ann the use of my negro Wench Mary & all her children & the use of my Negro Hannah & her children & of my negro boy namedanson and my will is that my said dearly beloved Wife shall live either at my Plantation at Horse Savannah or in Charles Town as she or my Executors shall think fit and be maintained clothed & supported in a decent befitting manner at the discretion
