 Debts be first paid and discharged. Item I give

 possession or reversion at the time of my decease, during
 her natural life. Item on the death of my mother Elizabeth
 Bowrey I give and Bequeath unto my Negro's Daniel

 my friend Benjamin Sanders of Prince Williams Parish
 the sum of five hundred pounds current money of
 this Province to be paid at my mothers decease to him and his
 heirs

Heirs and assigns forever. Item I give and Bequeath unto David
 Alexander son of David Alexander deceased all the real and residue
 of my estate real and personal to be delivered him on the death
 of my mother provided he be arrived to the age of one and twenty
 and not before to him and his heirs and assigns forever Next
 I do by these presents constitute nominate and appoint my loving
 friend Stephen Bull Jun^r Esq^r of Prince Williams Parish Planters
 Executor and my loving mother M^{rs} Elizabeth Bowrey Executrix
 of this my last will and Testament and I do hereby revoke re-
 vocation and make void all former wills and Testaments by me
 heretofore made and do declare and appoint this to be my last will and
 Testament By Witness whereof I the first above named William
 Bowrey have to this my last will and Testament contained in half
 a sheet of paper set my hand and seal this seventh day of December

Prizes that may fall due to me on a Cruise Intended to be performed in the *Boynes Privateer* of Dublin or any ship or ships that I may belong to also all wages, sum and sums of money lands Tenements Goods Chattels and Estate whatsoever or shall be any ways due, owing or belonging unto me at the time of my decease I do give devise and bequeath the same unto my dearly beloved wife Ann Mourmounet otherwise now and upon this special trust and Confidence that she do divide one half of such moneys substance as I shall die possessed of between such children as I shall leave at my decease share and share alike And I do hereby nominate and appoint my said wife Tho:^s Drollier and John Mariace Merchants Executors of this my last will and Testament hereby revoking all former and other wills Testaments and deeds of gifts by me at any time heretofore made and I do ordain and satisfy these presents to stand and be for and as my only last will and Testament In Witness whereof to this my said will I have set my hand and seal the fifteenth day of April Anno Domini 1757 and in the Thirtieth year of the reign of his Majesty King George the Second by the Grace of God over Great Britain and so forth *John Mourmounet* (seal)

and receive of and from the Right Honourable the Principal Officers and Commissioners of his Majesty's Navy, or whomsoever it may concern all and singular such salary, wages, tickets, Bounty money, Prize money, share allowance money, Share money, Ransoms and all other sum and sums of money whatsoever, as now is, or at any time or times hereafter shall be due, payable or belonging unto me for my own or any other service or otherwise in any of his Majesty's ships, frigates, or vessels, or any merchant ship or ships, and also of all other person or persons whatsoever, all and singular such other sum or sums of money salary wages Goods wares Merchandises Freight Profits, rents and arrears of rents, debts due duties claims and demands whatsoever which now is or at any time or times hereafter shall be due, owing and payable and belonging unto me, by any way or means, right or title whatsoever or howsoever giving and hereby granting unto my said attorney her substitutes and assigns all my authority and lawful power in the Premises, for receiving recovering, obtaining Compounding and discharging the same as fully and effectually as I myself might or could do, being personally present, and Acquittance, release, or any other discharge, in my name to make seal and deliver and one attorney or more to make substitute and at pleasure to revoke, satisfying and hereby confirming all and whatsoever my said attorney her substitutes and assigns or any of them shall lawfully do or cause to be done in and about the premises by virtue of these presents.
