 and according as circumstances of the place of my Decease may
 allow, Nothing Doubting but at the General Resurrection I shall receive
 the same again by the Power of God and as touching such worldly
 effects as it has pleased God to Bless me with in this life I
 freely give to Andrew Mcgregor on board said ship I constitute make
 and ordain sole Executor of this my last will and Testament all and singular
 my chest cloaths Bed & Bed cloths and have also what wages as may
 be due for my service done on board the ship Bance Island under Capt.
 Jm: Stearns Command. And I do utterly disallow Revok & Dissuall all
 former Testaments Wills Legacies Requests Executors before named by me:
 Ratifying and confirming this and no other to be my last Will and
 Testament in Witness Whereof I have set my Hand at Searaloe this
 Eighteenth day of January one thousand seven hundred and sixty one
 Signed published & Declared by the said
 Thomas Reuel as his last Will and Testament
