him the other two parts with my Real estate (that is to say my lands)
 the land that I now live upon to be left between my two children the
 other land, that was left by my father to be sold for the use of my children
 if one of the children dies before she comes of age, the other is to have
 her share and if both dies under age my widow if yet alive shall become
 heir to the whole after the payment of all legacies debts and funeral charges
 I likewise make constitute and appoint my Wife Mary M^cCrea, John
 M^cCrea, John Matthews and Alexander M^cCrea as Executors of this my
 last Will and Testament. And I do hereby revoke, renounce and disannul
 all former Wills and Testaments by me before this time made ratifying &

 all the rest & residue of my Estate of what kind or manner the same
 may be with all pay and arrears of pay that may be due to me at the
 time of my death I give and bequeath the same unto my brother Thomas Hewitt
 of the City of Cork in the Kingdom of Ireland Next^{ly} & in case of his decease before
 me then to his Eldest son & the Exors Admors assigns of such eldest son for
 ever only as a further gratuity to the s^d Dr^r Lionel Chalmers for his favours
 to me I give and bequeath him the further sum of twenty Guineas And I
 hereby nominate constitute and appoint the said Cap^t Arthur Price
