Inprimis it is my will that all my debts & funeral charges be first paid.

Item It is my will & desire that after my Estate both real and Personal is appraised that one fifth Part of the Amount of the Appraisement be Paid unto my Son J^r Postell twelve months after my death first deducting two hundred Pounds which I give and bequeath unto my grand daughter R^{os}a Postell to be paid her at the Day of Marriage, or when she shall arrive to the age of Twenty one and in Case my said grand daughter R^{os}a Postell shall die before she arrives to the age of Twenty one, or the Day of marriage then the said sum of two hundred Pounds shall go to my Daughter J^ames Dymen, Elizabeth Blamyer & my son John Postell and their Heirs forever.

Item It is my will & desire that Willey the son of Maria be sent to school to learn reading and writing and afterwards to be bound out to learn a trade and that after his apprenticeship up shall serve my Executors till he arrives to the age of Twenty five and then to be free.

Item It is my Will and desire that the rest & residue of my Estate both real and Personal be equally divided as followeth that is to say I give and bequeath one fourth part to my dearly beloved daughter J^ames Dymen and her Heirs forever.

Item I give and bequeath one fourth part unto my dear friend John Postell Sen^r In Trust for my dearly beloved daughter Elizabeth Blamyer and after her death and the death of her husband John Blamyer then to the lawful Issue of her body share and share alike and to no other use or Purpose whatsoever.

Item I give and Bequeath one fourth to my dearly beloved Son John Postell and his Heirs forever.

Item I give and bequeath the other fourth part to the Children of my Deceased daughter Magdalen Millen share and share alike the same to be put to Interest and to be paid each at the Day of Marriage or at the age of Twenty

Twenty one and in case any of the children shall die before Marriage or arriving to the age of Twenty one then such share to go the Survivor or Survivors share and share alike
 Item It is my will that my real Estate be either divided or sold as my Executors shall think proper.

Item It is my will that Mess^{rs} Robert Dymess, John Blamyer and John Pastell (my son) be Executors of this my last Will and Testament & I do hereby revoke all former Wills & Testaments by me made In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this first Day of November in the year of our Lord 1757
