Feb 20th 1761. Being sound in Body & mind but going on service against the Indians It is my last Will & Testament that in the Event of my death that all my Estate in Europe should be equally divided between my beloved son Lauchlan & my beloved daughter Bridget; that all my Estate in America shall be equally divided between my beloved wife Mary Shaw and the child she gives birth, but that the whole shall go to said child after the decease of the said Mary Shaw. But in case the money now in Lieut Governor Bulls hands should not be paid for Capt. Remers Company it shall be equally divided between the said Mary Shaw and the child now in her womb the whole of my Estate now in America to go to the longest liver viz^t the said Mary Shaw and the child during their lifetime and after their decease to be equally divided between the said Lauchlan Shaw & Bridget Shaw I appoint the said Mary Shaw and James Parson Esq. Lawyer in Charleston & Francis Penlock Esq. of Gilmerton Executors of said Will.
