Last Will and Testament hereby revoking all former and other wills and Wills by me at any time heretofore made and executed and do declare this only to be my last Will and Testament. In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and Seal this nineteenth day of March in the year of our Lord One Thousand Seven hundred and Sixty one and in the first year of the Reign Sovereign Lord George the Third by the Grace of God of Great Britain, France and Ireland King Defender of the Faith and so forth Signed sealed and published by the Testator as and for his Last Will & Testament in the Presence of us, in whose presence & at whose request we have subscribed our names as Witnesses

All that my dwelling house & ground to the same belonging situate on the East side of meeting street but in case she dye before that time then I give & devise & bequeath the said House and ground with all its appurtenances unto my loving wife Mary Milner and to her heirs & assigns forever. Item I will that my mother Ann Milner have a room in the said House, ready furnished and have the use of all my Negroes in Common with my wife & be decently supported and maintained during her life out of my estate And after my said Mothers decease I give and bequeath unto my said wife my negro man Dick a boatman, my negro man Mingo a Cooper, & Diobah a woman with her future issue and Increase Item I give & bequeath unto my said Daughter Mary my Negro Wench Sabina & her four children named Sam Colon Nelly & Bess with their Issue and Increase Item I give unto my Nephew John Colcock all my share right & Interest I have as a member of the Charles Town Library Society; Item I give unto John, Mary
