Dispoze in form & Manner as Followes I give the Quoth unto
my Son Anthony Benritte my two Negroes Samy & Jacob to him
& his heirs forever.

Item I give unto my Said Son Anthony a Set of Silver Tea
Spoons also my Silver Snuff Box.

Item I give to my Daughters Margarite Benritte Affby & Mary
Affby the Sum of Three Hundred Pounds Current money each
my Bed & Furniture all my House hold Goods one Table of Drawers
excepted which I give unto my Son Anthony Benritte I give the
Quoth unto my Daughter Catherine Benritte.

Item my riding Chair I give unto my Said Daughter Catherine.

Item one Set of Silver Soup Spoons also all the Horses & Cattle
I may be possessed of I leave unto my Daughter Catherine.

Item what money I may have by me or at Interest not already
disposed off I give to my said Daughter Catherine.

Item I give fifty Pounds to the Reverend Mr James Upcott
to buy him a gown.

Item I give twenty pounds To Miss Magdalina Combi

Item if my Son or Daughter Catherine Should die before they
are of age or married I appoint them to be Heirs to each other
and of this my last Will & Testament I appoint Constable
& John Paul Trappier Esq^r Sam^l Benritte Mr. Beny^a
Benritte my Sole Executors revoking & annulling all other
Wills that I may have made before this & declaring this my
Sole last Will & Testament. Feby 25. 1758
