1763 I Moses Pearson of Curawau County & Province of South Carolina German
being of perfect mind & memory thanks be given unto God therefore calling unto mind the
mortality of my body & knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die do
make & ordain this my last Will & Testament that is to say principally & first of all
I give & recommend my Soul into the hands that gave it & for my body I recommend
it to the earth to be buried in a Christian like manner at the discretion of my Executors
nothing doubting but at the General Resurrection I shall receive the same again
by the mighty power of God & as touching such worldly Estate wherewith it hath
pleased God to bless me in this life I give devise & dispose of the same in the fol-
lowing manner & form, Imprimis It is my will & do order that in the first
place all my just debts & funeral charges be paid & satisfied
Item I give & bequeath unto my well beloved son Baron Pearson one shilling
sterling Item I give & bequeath unto my beloved Son Moses Pearson one shilling
sterling Item I give & bequeath unto my beloved Daughter Ruth Aiken one shilling
sterling Item I give & bequeath to my beloved Daughter Sarah Cherry one shilling
sterling Item I give & bequeath to my beloved son Brabant Pearson the plantation
that I now live upon a hundred & fifty acres of land being the half of the three hun-
dred acres to him & his heirs a feather bed & furniture & horse & a pacing mare &
Coek a plow & a Negro fellow named Jupiter & three cows & calves one dish & three
plates Item I give & bequeath unto my beloved daughter Comfort Pearson
one hundred & fifty acres of Wood land called the walnut bluff to her & her heirs (S)

a feather bed & furniture one dish & three plates & a mare & colt & a Negro
much named Dinah. Item I give & bequeath to my beloved Wife Sarah Pearson
two feather beds and furniture & some pewten & all my household Goods
& Chattels to her & her heirs forever & it is my desire & it is my desire that
she shall have the Childrens legacy in her hands to raise the said Children
till they comes of age. Item I give & bequeath to my beloved Wife
all my hogs & horses & moreables to her & heirs forever. Item I likewise
constitute & appoint my beloved wife Sarah Pearson my Sole Executrix
of this my last Will & Testament & I do hereby utterly disallow revoke
to disannul all & every other former Testaments wills legacies & Executors
by me in any ways before this time willed & bequeathed ratifying & confirming
this and no other to be my last Will & Testament. In Witness whereof
