Do make & Ordain this my last Will & Testament that is to say principally & first of all to give & bequeath my soul unto God that gave it and for my body I recommend to the Earth to be buried in a Christian manner at the Discretion of my Executors nothing doubting but at the General Resurrection I shall receive the same again by the mighty power of God, and as touching such worldly Estate wherewith it hath pleased God to bless me with in this life I give & Bequeath the same in the following manner & form. Imprimis it is my will & I do order that all my my just debts & general charges be first paid. Item I give to son James Larock the sum of five pounds. Item it is my will that my Estate both real & personal to be paid & equally divided between my beloved wife Mary Larock, my son Benjamin Larock & my Daughters Ann Larock, & Abigail Larock, & that my Daughters share Ann Larock & Abigail shall be put to Interest till they shall come to the age of eighteen on the Day of Marriage in case either of them should die before that age or the Day of Marriage then their part to be divided between the survivors & my wife Part after her decease to be equally divided between my son Benjamin Larock & my daughters Ann Larock & Abigail Larock. Likewise nominate constitute appoint & ordain my beloved wife Mary Larock Executrix my son Benjamin Larock Executor to this my last will & testament, revoking & disannulling all other & former Wills & Legacies & before the acknowledging this & neither to be my last Will & Testament as witness my hand & seal the day & year above written.

But in case my aforesaid niece should die without

without leave then my will and I give & bequeath all my present Estate to Andrew Laird of Dundee in North Brittan March 3rd this year leaving in the discretion of the said Andrew Laird to give any of my poor Relations what appertains to me may think them deserving of itth I do by these presents empower & authorize my Executor & Executrix after mentioned to sell & dispose of all or any part of my former Estate either real or personal or they shall be proper or meet for the Benefit of my poor Niece & Sister I do hereby nominate & appoint my good Friends James Sharp of Jacksonville March 3rd William Lewis Benjamin Eaton & Andrew Hunter of the aforesaid Executors of this my last Will & Testament, and I do hereby revoke all former or other Will or Wills by me at any time made and declare this my only last Will & Testament, done witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand, seal the eighth day of November in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred & sixty one and in the second year of his Majestys Reign signed sealed published & pronounced by the testator to be his last Will & Testament at whose desire, in whose presence we have signed our names witness

their increase unto her my said Daughter Claudia Elliott her heirs & assigns
forever also I give unto my said daughter Claudia Elliott all that she is indebted

to
