New Providence I Patrick Marshall of Charlestown in the Province
of South Carolina Merchant now residing in this Island being in perfect Health &
sound in my judgment & Understanding Ordains this to be my last Will & Testament
the first place I desire that my affairs both in Carolina & this Island may be
settled as soon as ^{may be} convenient in order to clear my just debts paid & after that is done
I desire what remains to be my property may be divided in the following manner.
I desire that Twenty pounds Sterling yearly may be paid to my mother Janet
Marshall in Dundee in Scotland during her life which at her death is to be
divided among my other Legatees hereafter mentioned. I give to my nephew
Robert Ramsey his choice of Edward Mayall negro man George Claffie & Bob
if its agreeable to Mr. Dewar if not I give Robert Ramsey as much money as the
highest Price any of them sells for together with my wearing apparel my watch
silver plate Wine Glasses, Glass Plates & Glass & one pair of my gold chain Buttons
Excepted which I give to the Oldest son of my Brother Willm Marshall Merchant in
Dundee in Scotland. I give to my Brother Alexander Marshall Skipper master a Quarter
part of my Estate together with my Naghagony Chest & Boat and the Books belonging to
the

the Post Slave with my negro Boy Jannie in law of which I wish to give my Brother Charles Marshall one of Deaver & Marshall's negro men before mentioned if agreeable to Mr. Deaver, or the value of the negro in Cash. I give to the lawful female Issue of my Brother Charles Marshall of this Island a quarter part of my Estate which I would recommend to be put to Interest for them till they marry or are Judges capable by my Executor to manage it. I give to my sister Margaret Marshall in Bundee in Scotland a Quarter Part of my Estate to be remitted her as she shall direct. I give to the Female issue of my sister Elizabeth Mill of Bundee in Scotland the other Quarter of my Estate which I recommend to the care of my Brother William Marshall to be equally divided among them. I have poor trifling Debts & Creditors belonging to me such as Battaloo & Peading, Lablee, two Drates, & a Horse which my Brother Charles & Alexander may desire of them but I would not have them exposed to sale. There is a Bond & M mortgage Indebtedness with this by which it will appear that my Brother Charles is in my debt, but I desire he may have no trouble about this while he lives up to the settlement of my affairs. I have my own particular affairs I should thereby be deforded for some time that it must be settled as my Brothers George & Alexander shall think proper at their Death. I appoint my worthy Friend Mr. Charles Deaver of Charlestown who is now my Partner in trade My Brother George Marshall My Brother Alexander Marshall, & my Brother Charles Marshall of this Island the Executors of this Will, who I am well assured will manage my little Affairs with integrity wherefore I have nothing further to recommend to them than the care of my worthy aged Mother. I am an enemy to superfluous funerals wherefore I make no other provision for my own but to order it to be done at as little Expence as Decency will admitt of, that no minister may be hired to Read prayers at it. I hope it will give no offence to my Brothers William & George & my Sister Janet that I have not Bequeathed them any Part of my Estate which I know must be as trifling after my debts are paid as not to be worth their acceptance knowing them all to be much better circumstances in life than those to whom I have given it & hold them in the same Esteem as I do my other Brothers & Sisters especially my Brother William whose good offices to me when I was incapable to help myself I have had and ever will have a greatful sense of, I hope they will approve of this division I have made of the little I may die possessed of.

³⁵ New Providence Before His Excellency William Shirley Esq; Captain General Governor & Commander in Chief in and over His Majestys Bahama Islands and Ordinary of the same personally came and appeared Charles Marshall Esq; who being duly sworn on the Holy Evangelists of Almighty God Made Oath that sometime ago his Brother Patrick Marshall deceased acquainted him that he had made his Will in which he had left a legacy to his Nephew Robert

Robert Ramsey deceased, which is in the words following that is to say "I give to my Nephew Robert Ramsey his choice of Duvar & Marshall's Negro men George, Caffier, But if it's agreeable to Mr. Duvar if not I give Robert Ramsey as much money as the highest price any of them ^{will} sell for, together with my weareing apparel my watch silver sheet, Silver Buckle, stock Buckle & clasp and one pair of Gold Slave Buttons Excepted, which I leave to the Oldest son of my Brother William Marshall Merchant in Dundee in Scotland" which Legacy the said Patrick Marshall did Inform & Aquaint this DepONENT was only intended to go to the said Robert Ramsey only and not to his Nephew as he knew Robert Ramseys Children were provided for and the DepONENT further says that the said Robert Ramsey having departed this life before the said Patrick Marshall the said Patrick Marshall thereupon did acquaint him with his said intention and design aforesaid & ordered him this DepONENT to make that part of his Will if he was not able to do it himself

In the Name of God Amen. I Joseph Waring of the Parish of St Georges Berkeley County in the Province of South Carolina being sick, sit in Bodily but of sound mind & memory but, remembering my mortality, do make & ordain this to be my last will and testament as follows. First my will is that all my just debts & finnell expenses be well & truly paid & satisfied, so soon as may be after my decease.
Also it is my will & I do impower my Executors to pay out of my Estate to the Commissioners of the Free School in Rochester the sum of two hundred pounds current money of the Province apiece to be laid out as they shall think fit for the maintenance or Education of poor children Also I give, and Bequeath unto my wife Eliz^a Waring daughter of my Bro^r in Law Joseph Waring, the sum of one hundred pounds current money of the Province apiece to be paid at interest by my Executors & the principal sum least to be paid by my Executors, or the Survivor of them when she shall arrive to the age of eighteen years or day of marriage which shall first happen. Also I give Davis & Bequeath unto my beloved wife Mary Waring a young Negro Manch named Hagar also my riding Chair together with those of my other Horse to her & her heirs forever. Also I give unto my beloved wife
