decent Christian Burial at the discretion of my Executor
nothing doubting but at the General Resurrection I shall
receive the same again by the mighty power of God. And
as touching such worldly estate wherewith it hath pleased
God to bless me in this life I give demise and dispose of the
same in the following manner and form. First I give
and bequeath to Peter Mellick my well beloved son the
sum of ten shillings Current money. Also I give and
bequeath to Marthe Mellick my well beloved daughter
the sum of Two hundred pounds Current money and
one half of a stock of Cattle marked in each ear, with two
black half pence, and branded thus **P**. Also I give
and bequeath to Sarah Brunson my well beloved daughter
the sum of Ten shillings Current money. Also I give and
bequeath to Mary Mellick my well beloved daughter the
sum of Three hundred pounds Current money and one
half of the abovesaid stock of Cattle. Also I give and
bequeath to Jane Howze my well beloved grand daughter
the sum of Ten shillings Current money. I likewise
Constitute make and ordain Daniel Brunson sole
Executor of this my last will and Testament and of
do hereby utterly disallow revoke and disannul
all and every other former Testaments Wills legacies
Bequests and Executors by me in any wayes before named
Made and bequeathed Ratifying and Confirming
this and no other to be my last Will and Testament
In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal
this nineteenth day of July 1763 — Peter Mellick seal

Chney of Charles town South Carolina, Dutchen, being sick and
weak in body, but of sound and disposing mind and memory
and calling to mind the uncertainty of this frail and transitory
estate, and that all flesh must yield up to death, I first and
principally commend my soul into the hands of Almighty
God my creator hoping for mercy and salvation in and through
the infinite merits of his son Jesus Christ my Redeemer and my
body I commit to the Earth to be decently interred at the discretion
of my Executors or Executors hereinafter named and as for
such worldly Estate as it hath pleased God to bestow upon
me, I give and bequeath the same as follows. I hereby
give and bequeath unto all my children without distinction
that is to say unto my son Christopher Eschard Chney and
my three daughter named Anna Maria the wife of John
Miller, Christina the wife of J. J. Hoff and Magdalena
the wife of John Spidel to each and every one of them, the full
and just sum of one shilling Sterling and no more on which
said sum or sums to be raised and levied out of my Estate
after my decease. Item I give and bequeath unto my loving
wife
