In the name of God Amen. I Peter Rumph of Baltimore County St. Bartholomew's Parish being weak in Body but of sound & perfect mind and memory and knowing that it is appointed for all men to die do make this my last will & Testament in manner and form following viz. Inprimis I recommend my soul unto the hands of Almighty God, who gave it, and my Body to the Earth to be buried in a Christianlike manner at the Discretion of my Executors here after named. Next I will and desire all my just Debts be paid after payment of which I desire and Will is that all my Estates both real & personal be equally divided between my wife Katherine Rumph and my four Children David Katherine Mary and Susannah Item I will my childrens Dividends be delivered to them at the age of Twenty one years or day of marriage which first shall happen Item I will that if either of my said Children should die before they arrive to the age of twenty one years or Day of marriage that then their part be equally divided between the Surviving Brothers or Sisters Item I will that if either my said Children marry and die without Issue lawfully Begotten or in failure of Issue of their Body, that then their part be equally divided between my surviving Children or their heirs. Item I will that if my Executors think proper and most to advantage to my wife and Children to sell the Plantation whereon I now live provided they can get six pounds per acre for the same and also my Plantation at the round provided they can get two pounds ten shillings per acre and also my tract of Land adjoining the Presbyterian Parsonage to be sold or retained at their Discretion and also a tract of land lying at Goose Creek bought by me of Thomas Seidburn and left to him by Samuel Elms Item I desire my Executors to have my son David properly Educated as they shall think proper Item I will if my Executors should think proper not to sell my lands that my wife have a maintenance on the Plantation I now live on, or any other of my Lands Item I Empower my Executors to buy or sell or Renew or otherwise act as they shall think proper most advantageous to my wife and Children Lastly I do constitute and appoint Daniel Droye James Tendawis Abraham Rump and Michael Sigar Executors of this my last Will and Testament hereby Revoking and Disannulling all

James Mills and Bequests whatsoever. Witness my hand

In the name of God Amen I Eleanor Lobley of Beau-
port in the Parish of St. Helena Widow being weak in Body
destitute of sound mind and memory blessed be God I do make and Publish
this as my last Will and Testament in manner following I do recommend
my soul to its Almighty Creator hoping to obtain mercy thro the
merits of my dear Redeemer & Saviour Jesus Christ & my body I
return to the dust in hopes of a joyfull Resurrection I do give &
Bequeath to the Children of my dear sister Elizabeth Gordon wife
of John Gordon of Beauport Merchant all my lands, slaves & money
that I am now possessed of to be equally divided among them
so soon as they are of age or married. Excepting the following par-
ticulars which I desire my Executors may strictly comply with & I give
& relinquish all right & title that I now have in a Negro Woman named
Emy to her entire freedom & liberty & I do hereby request that my sister
may also give up & relinquish her title to her part so soon as this my
last Will is recorded and it is also my Will & desire that in case the
said Negro Woman should survive my said sister or that my sister should
goe of this Province & that the said Emy should not chuse to goe with
her that in either of these cases fifty Pounds Current money of this
Province shall be punctually paid to the said Negro woman Emy every
year during her life at four Quarterly Payments out of the Interest
of the money I may die possessed of I do give and Bequeath to
Mr. Samuel Lobley Brother to my dearly beloved Husband
Jemmit Lobley Deceased the sum of fifty pounds sterling
money of Great Britain in return for what Annuity he gave
to me. Item it is my Will that my sister Elizabeth Gordon shall not have
any right to the Interest of my money or what may arise from the
sale of the lands except she is left a widow in which case she shall
have a right to use the interest during her Widowhood or till each
of the Children of her present marriage may be of age or married
I do would recommend that the sum yearly lent in Charita-
town be kept & built upon as fast as fast as the Interest of the
money with the principall will permit judging it the best security
for Childrens fortunes in this Province I do in my Will that
Mr. John Gordon be paid the sum of Two hundred and fifty pounds
being the sum allowed the Estate for the Negro Woman named Emy
