Item my will is that twenty pounds Currency be laid out in buying for each of my Sons a small token of my esteem when they in Kitchens or shops & have hereunto set my hand & Seal this sixteenth Day of March in the year of our Lord One Thousand Seven Hundred & sixty five & of his Majesty's reign the fourth

In the Name of God Amen I Richard Bailey  
of St Bartholomew Parish Ballston County and Province of S<sup>c</sup> Carolina being  
weak & sickly in Body but of sound disposing mind and memory blessed  
be God and withall considering the frailty of human nature & the shortness  
of this present life do make and declare this to be my last Will & Testament  
and do dispose of that substance wherewith it hath pleased God to bless me in  
manner & upon following Injunctions my will is that all my just debts  
be fully paid and discharged. Item I give & bequeath unto my Nephews  
James Kelsor, William Dickburn, Richard Bailey Dickburne & my niece  
Elizabeth Brown (Daughter of John Martha Brown) to them and their heirs  
forever fourteen negro slaves named Lemmy Runnah and child Ben London  
and Catharine his wife & Boy Jacoby, Jacob Cato, Pries & child Sarah her  
husband, and Lewis together with their issue and increase to be Equally  
divided among them share and share alike when they respectively arrive  
at the age of twenty one years or after my debts are fully paid at the discretion  
of my Executrix hereafter named. But if James Kelsor, William Dickburne  
or Elizabeth Brown or either of them shall happen to die before they attain  
the aforesaid age of twenty one years that then his or her portion or share  
so dying shall be Equally divided between the survivors or survivor of the  
afore said legacies but if Richard Bailey Dickburne should die before he attain  
the age twenty one years aforesaid then my will is that his portion or  
share

Share of the said fourteen negro slaves and their issue shall become the property  
of his father Thomas Dickburn and his heirs forever. Item I give and bequeath  
unto my Son Thomas Bailey son of John Bailey and his heirs forever a mare  
named Dec & a cow and a calf to be delivered him as soon convenient after my  
decease also fifty pounds Currency to be paid him within one year after my  
decease. Item I give and bequeath unto Joseph & Hull son of Joseph Bay  
come with calves or higg with calf to be likewise delivered him as soon as convenient  
after my decease at the discretion of my Executors hereinafter named.  
Item I give and bequeath unto my nephew Richard Bailey Dickburne and the heirs  
of his body forever all that plantation or tract of land at Cheraw which I lately  
purchased of M<sup>r</sup> Jonathan Cooper to be delivered him the said Richard Bailey  
Dickburne so soon as he shall attain the age of twenty one years reserving nevertheless  
to my beloved wife Rachael Bailey the liberty of planting on or making use of the  
said plantation as she shall think proper during the full end and term of her natural  
life. But if the aforesaid Richard Bailey Dickburne shall die without any lawful  
heirs of his body or before he arrive at the age of twenty one years aforesaid my will  
is that the aforesaid plantation shall become the property of his father Thomas  
Dickburn and his heirs forever.

Item my will is that my Brother Thomas Dickburn be allowed to live and reside  
on the aforesaid plantation at Cheraw and have the liberty of working his slaves  
thereon till my debts are fully paid or while he shall continue to manage the best  
for the benefit of my estate which shall be determined by my Executrix herein  
after named and no other.

Item I give and bequeath unto my beloved wife Rachael Bailey the whole residue  
and remainder of my estate both real and personal which is not hereinbefore  
bequeathed. Next therefore my will is that she allow my Brother Thomas Dickburn  
the liberty to work his slaves on or any part of my lands where she shall think  
proper.

Nearly I do hereby nominate and appoint my beloved wife Rachael Bailey  
Executrix and my friends James Sharp and Sidney Kinsport Juniors Executors of this  
my last will and Testament and I do hereby revoke all former Will or Wills by me  
at any time made and declare this only to be my last will and Testament.  
In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and Seal this seventeenth  
Day of February in the year of our Lord One Thousand Seven Hundred & Sixty  
five and in the fourth year of his Majesty's reign
