Item I give to my said sister Mary Godfrey during her natural life and no longer the use and labour of three negroes Item I give to my brother William Wright my English mare called Nancy Dawson and my two riding horses and saddle and bridle Item I give to my grand William Guerin of Charles Town Merchant my black mare called Blaze Item I give to my brother Abraham Wright a grey mare called Calfax Item I give to my nephew Isaac Wright the son of my brother Isaac Wright a young grey Shantegon horse called Jockey Item my will further is and I do hereby order and direct that all the Rest Residue and Remainder of my estate both real and personal by me hereby not before disposed of be exposed to sale as soon as conveniently can be after my decease by my Executors hereafter named and that the monies arising therefrom shall in the first place be applied for and towards the payment and satisfaction of my debts and funeral charges and the overplus of such money after payment of my debts as aforesaid I do hereby direct and appoint the same to be equally divided to and amongst my Brothers and nephews of the name of Wright and Rooley who hereby constitute and appoint my two brothers Abraham and William Wright and my good friend William Guerin of Charles Town Merchant and the survivors and survivor of them Executors of this my last Will and Testament hereby revoking and making void and null all former and other will or wills by me heretofore made declaring this and this only to be my last Will and Testament In Witness whereof I have to this my last Will and Testament set my hand and seal The day and year first

above written.

In the Name of God amen, I Robert Millen of St Georges parish Berkleigh County in the Province aforesaid being weak and low in state of health but of sound and perfect mind and memory do make this my last Will and Testament that is to say I first and principally I commend my soul into the hands of almighty God hoping through the merits, death and passion of my blessed Saviour to have full pardon and forgiveness of all my sins and to inherit everlasting life my body I commit to the earth to be decently buried as my Executors shall think proper In witness whereof I have hereunto subscribed my name and seal the first day of January 1765. It is my will that all my debts and funeral charges be first paid Item I give my negro girl named Sabina to my daughter Martha Millen to her and her heirs Item It is my will that my estate be equally divided share and share alike between my dearly beloved wife Mary Millen my daughter Martha Millen and the child my wife is pregnant with but if the child should be a boy then I give and bequeath my plantation at the Indian Land to him. Item it is my will that my wife share should be delivered to her as soon as my affairs are settled to be at her own disposal. Item It is my will that my daughter Martha do receive her part or portion at the age of eighteen or the day of marriage but if she dies before the day of marriage or the age of eighteen then her part to go to the child my wife is pregnant with. Item it is my will that if the child my wife is pregnant with be a boy then he shall receive his part or portion at the age of twenty one but if he should die before the age of twenty one unmarried then his part to go to my daughter Martha and if both of my children should die before the ages above mentioned

Mentioned, then my wife to have the use of the children's shares or Proportions during her life and at her death they to be Equally divided between my Brothers and sisters and the children of Sarah Goodbee and the children of William Nyatt, that is to say between Phyl Goodbee, Martha Goodbee, Ebenezer Nyatt and John Nyatt. Item It is my Will and desire that my dearly beloved wife do maintain my Honourable Father decently as long as he lives and I do hereby nominate and appoint my dear wife Executrix as long as she remains my widow with my dear friends Messrs Miles Vergison, James Smith and Charles Brown Executors of this my last will and Testament. So Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this twenty seventh day of November Anno Dom 1764.
