of body but of sound & disposing mind & memory (I praised be God for the same)
and being desirous to settle my worldly affairs which I have strength and
Capacity so to do I do make & publish this my last Will and Testament And
first & Principally I commit my soul into the hands of my Creator who gave
it and my body to the Earth to be interred at the discretion of my Sons hereafter
named and as to such worldly estate wherewith I hath pleased God to furnish
me I Dispose of the same as followeth that is to say I do give & bequeath
all my just debts & singular Expenses be paid and discharged
I do give & bequeath unto my beloved wife Ursula Jeanneret her
Heirs & assigns forever all that my tract of land containing three hundred
acres situate on the Head of River May Watling & bounding to
the South on River May & West on John Henry's (the Roche to the north
on Michael Sealy to the East on Capt^m Pasche's land I then I give and
bequeath likewise unto my said wife Ursula all that my one other tract of land
containing seven hundred acres situate in the Township of Parishburg on the South
Swamp Watling & bounding to the north on Cac^t Land to the East on Cac^t Land

to the south on River conveyed by me to Daniel Hayward Esq^r to the West part on
Michael Rorer & part on Henry Chiffeller. I then I give and bequeath likewise unto
my said wife Ursula all that my one other tract of land containing ^{two hundred} fifty acres
situate in the Township of Parishburg on Saranah River Watling & bounding
to the West on Saranah River to the north on Cac^t Land to the East on John Henry's
the Roche to the south on Crownburg's land I then I give and bequeath likewise
unto my said wife Ursula all that my Town lot situate in the Township of Parishburg
11th 14th Watling and bounding to the north on David Sney's lot to the West on the
Bay to the South on a Strick & to the East on David Sney's lot I then I give and
bequeath unto my said wife Ursula her Heirs & assigns forever
all and singular my negroes horses mares Cattle & stock with their future
Issue and Increase & all and singular my household goods furniture and other my
Personal Estate of what nature or kind soever. I then I give unto my sister
Mary twenty shillings Current money of the Province appraised I then I give
unto my other sister Rose Mary twenty shillings Current money of the Province
appraised I then I give and devise unto my two Nephews Henry and David Jeanneret
one of my Brother Abram Jeanneret the sum of five pounds Current money of the
Province appraised each And lastly I do hereby nominate constitute &
appoint my said beloved wife Ursula the sole Executrix of this my last Will
& Testament And I do hereby revoke and make void all former & other Will
and Testament by me at any time or times hereafter made and I do declare this

hereby confirming all my former wills first I commit my soul to God in the
Power of his Mercy through Jesus Christ, and of a joyful Resurrection and my
body I commit to the earth to be decently buried at the discretion of my

of my own, as near the remains of my late husband as may be so as not to touch the foundation of his Tomb which was Disturbed on him by My Beloved Niece M^{rs} Sarah Frankland I then it is my will that all my just debts and general charges, be paid and satisfied as soon as conveniently may be after my decease Hoping that Thome's Bankland Esq^r and my said Niece's husband (whose mortgage on the said Clogon House estate may perhaps go near to swallow the whole) will not avail themselves of that mortgage, so as to cut off the just demand of my other Creditors. To his and their benefit however and to avoid the tedious process of Law & to express the regard I have for some other friends & the justice I would do them I think it incumbent on me to make this will. And it is my will that all the Estate real & personal whereof I am possessed except what is in this will specifically bequeathed be sold by my Executors hereafter mentioned in the manner I shall direct that is to say all the produce of my plantations fit for sale and all other produce of the Labour of my negroes such as Tarr Lumber &c. &c. & the like all my remaining Household Furniture (excepting Plate my wearing apparel & other things specifically bequeathed) and all the plantation stock of Cattle Horses & Hogs or such of that stock as can be spared from carrying on the Business of the Plantation (which I would have continued until advice arrives from M^{rs} Thos^s Frankland with directions to my Executors (or his attorney if he appointed one) how they are to proceed in regard to the mortgages) to be sold by Publick Sales to the highest bidder at my decease or within the space of a proper credit not exceeding twelve months upon bond and security for some exceeding twenty pounds. But as to the real Estate & negroes it is my will that they shall not be sold but at such time and at such place as I then direct or in S^c Carolina and in such manner as shall be directed by the said Thos^s Frankland Esq^r my Executors or Admors having left a letter of advice to him on that subject duplicates of which I desire may be forwarded to him by my Executors immediately after my decease as also a copy of my will and I do fully empower my Executors to make sufficient Debts for all my Real Estate which they shall sell according to the directions & intentions of this my will and if there be any surplus of my Estate after paying all my debts as aforesaid I do in that case bequeath the following legacies which in case there be no surplus of my estate after paying my debts the said legacies shall depend upon the Permission or Approbation of the said Thos^s Frankland his Executors or Admors the legacies are I give to my Beloved Niece M^{rs} Sarah Frankland my wedding Ring (Plain gold as a Particular mark of affection and a Memento of my Conjugal Happiness not doubting there is equal and may it prove as lasting

from to my beloved Niece M^{rs} Mary Jane Dry &c. and bequeath my gold Watch, with of modern make such an Excellent piece of mechanism the gold chain and all the trinkets belonging thereto to be worn in Remembrance of their affectionate Aunt who long & happy lived her happiness I then to my Beloved Niece the daughter of my Sister M^{rs} Mary Smith of Cha^s Town & M^{rs} Mary Hamilton of the same Place M^{rs} Mrs. Swann of Newport I give a mourning Ring to each of them to be worn in Remembrance of their affectionate Aunt, wishing to them & theirs a series of many happy Years. Then to my beloved Grandniece Miss Mary Frankland I give and bequeath my silver lined Tea Kettle and Cream Pot & lamp as also my walnut tree veneered Tea chest containing three pieces of Plate chased as the Tea Kettle in the form of urns for Tea & Sugar which I begg she will accept as a small instance of my affection accompanied with my Blessing. Then I give to my Grandniece M^{rs} Harriet Frankland my largest silver watch as a small instance of my affectionate Remembrance of her accompanied with my Blessing. Then I give to my Dear Grandniece Miss Rebecca Dry as a small instance of my affection a silver Tea spoon and strainer in a Black Shagreen Case almost new designed to accompany and hold a silver Silver Coffee Pot put into her possession when I come to England in the year 1756 which I also give to her together with a Shagreen sitting stand quite new to encourage her in that part of her Education in which she seems to be making great progress within these late months. Then I give to my Beloved M^{rs} Mary Jane Dry my silver Saucepan. Then I give to my beloved Grandniece Miss Susanah Russell a Mahogany Dressing Table & a little quilt smelling bottle. Then I give to my Beloved Grandniece Mary Russell a little Mahogany Tea chest. Then I give as small tokens of my love & kind remembrance of them attended with my Blessing. Then I give all the books of modern Fasts which I shall die possessed of to my Grandniece before mentioned Rebecca Dry and Susanah Russell to be divided between them as Equally as both can use, and it is my further request that the books thus bequeathed may be kept for their use and behoof only not to be lent out and by that means the sets may be broken before they can use them. Then it is my will & desire that all my wearing apparel of what kind soever be immediately put into the hands of my Beloved Niece M^{rs} Dry & my much loved & esteemed friend M^{rs} Dr. Rosset Esq^r to be disposed of as in their judgments shall seem meet. Then I give to my Dear & constant friend M^{rs} Dry Esq^r a mourning Ring as Testimony of my sense of his unwearied Goodness to me. Then I give to my much loved & long esteemed friend M^{rs} Dr. Rosset Esq^r my silver Black Shagreen Case as a small instance of my affection. Then I ordain that the said M^{rs} Dr. Rosset & M^{rs} Dry have the care of all my private papers. It is also my request that all M^{rs} Franklands letters which they will know by the Endorsement may be sealed up without opening & be sent to her in

England by the first safe hand as to all my other letters to & from my
 several correspondents abroad & is America as also what his children &
 have of the amissing kind I consign them entirely to their discretion
 Item It is my will that my letters & M^{rs} Allen of which there are several
 bundles kept secret from the eyes of any except these my two friends
 whose satisfaction may perhaps may lead them to require some of them after
 this the Jewell be the properest Repository for them and all the rest of
 my private letters. The other letters and papers relating to business must
 be left with my Executors. Item It is my will that one acre
 of land round the Tomb of my deceased Husband be reserved & cased for the
 use of our Cemetery on burying ground by my Executors when the part of the
 Plantation of Littleport shall be sold & I do require my Executors to cause a
 proper walling to be made round the said Tomb stone Lastly I nominate
 and appoint my friends James Murray & W^m Day Esquires & Henry Haynes
 Executors of this my last will in this Province and in Case of the Decease of
 one or two of them I do nominate & appoint J^{es} Frederick Jones of the
 Oak Sect & most Benjamin Haynes Esq to supply the place of such or as are dead
 & I do further nominate and appoint W^m Bampffield of S^c Carolina Merch^t
 Executor of this will as to that part of my Estate which lies in South Carolina
 In testimony whereof I have set my hand & seal unto this my last
 will consisting of two pages this 28th of Jan^r in the year of our Lord one
 thousand seven hundred & sixty one.

 William Williams of Charles Town say now to be my Executors of this my last will and
 Testament in further testimony whereof I have here set my hand and affix my seal
 this 28th day of February in the year of our Lord one thousand seven
 hundred and sixty one
