 and recommend my soul into the hands of almighty God That gave
 it and my body I recommend to the earth to be buried in a decent Christian
 Burial at the discretion of my executors Nothing doubting but
 at the General Resurrection I shall receive the same again by the
 mighty power of God and Touching such worldly Estate wherewithal it
 has pleased God to bless me with in this life I give devise & dispose
 of the same in the following manner First I give & bequeath to
 my Beloved Daughter Mary Mitchells children By name Will
 Mitchell & John Mitchell Three negroes By names Tom Cale & Ned
 after all my lawful debts being paid likewise I give to my son an
 law Philip Aleck Children By name Philip Thomas & William
 Three negroes by name Satur Jane & Isaac to them and their heirs for
 ever Also I give to my beloved son Thomas Osborn all the rest of
 my Estate both real and personal, & therefore appoint make and
 ordain Philip Aleck Executor & Mary Mitchell Executrix of this
 my last will and testament To act in the behalf as an executor & executrix
 And I do hereby by utterly disallow revoke and Disannule all & Every
 other former Wills & Testaments whatever made by me In witness
 whereof I have hereunto set my hand seal the day & year above written

Item I give and bequeath unto my six Grandchildren one hundred pounds to be paid out of my Estate to each and singular of them as they shall marry or come of age Item I give unto my beloved son David Batcheller all the residue or remainder of my Estate whom I like wise constitute make & ordain my sole Executor of this my last Will & Testament and I do hereby utterly disallow revoke and disannul all & every other former Testament Wills legacies and Requests and Executors by me in any ways before named Willed and bequeathed ratified and Confirming this and no other to be my last will and Testament in Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal the day and year above written

In the Name of God amen I John Gordon of Charles Town, Planter, do make this my last will and Testament I give and bequeath all my Estate real & personal whatsoever and wheresoever to Martin Campbell, James Parsons and William Guerin of Charles Town aforesaid and the survivors & survivors of them and the heirs Executors & administrators of such survivor to trust that they and the survivors & survivors of them & the heirs Executors and administrators of such survivor shall & will out of the last & profits to arise therefrom in the first place maintain Cloath School and Educate Penelope the daughter of my Negro wench named Molly until the said Penelope shall arrive of the age of eighteen years and be married and then and not before pay unto her the sum of five hundred pounds lawful money of Great Britain and in trust that they the said Martin Campbell, James Parsons & William Guerin and the survivors & survivors of them do pay unto William Bassford who formerly lived with me the sum of one thousand pounds Current money of South Carolina and unto Ann Mimick of Georgia the sum of one thousand pounds Current money during her life and after her death the said last mentioned sum of one thousand pounds Current money to the issue of her body that shall be then living to be equally divided amongst such issue share and share alike lastly I do hereby nominate constitute and appoint the said Martin Campbell, James Parsons & William Guerin and the survivors and survivors of them Executors and Executor of this my last will and Testament In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal the thirteenth day of January in the year of our Lord One thousand seven hundred and sixty two
