Principally and first of all I give and Recommend my soul into the hands of almighty God That gave it and my body I Recommend to the earth to be buried in a decent christian Buriall at the discretion of my executors Nothing doubting but at the the General Resurrection I shall receive the same again by the mighty power of God and touching such worldly Estate wherewith it has pleased God to bless me with in this life. I give demise & dispose of the same in the following manner First I give & bequeath to my Beloved Daughter Mary Mitchell's childrens by name Will^m Mitchell & John Mitchell Three negroes by names Noh Cale & Ned after all my lawful debts being paid likewise I give to my son in law Philip Aerts Children by name Philip Thomas & William Three negroes by names Satins Jane & Isaac to them and there heirs for ever. Also I give to my beloved son Thomas Ceborn all the rest of my Estate both real and personal, I therefore appoint make and Ordain Philip Aerts Executor & Mary Mitchell Executrix of this my last will and Testament. To act in the behalf of an executor & Executrix And I do hereby by utterly disallow revoke and Disannul all & Every other former Wills & Testaments whatever made by me. Imprimus I give and bequeath unto my beloved daughter Elizabeth Heathers one large oril Cabel one Ring and my wearing aparil and to my beloved Daughter in law Sarah Batchellor my gold buttons

I then I give and bequeath unto my six Grandchildren one hundred pounds to be paid out of my Estate to each and singular of them as they shall marry or come of age I then I give unto my beloved son David Batchellor all the residue or remainder of my Estate whom I like wise constitute make & ordain my sole Executor of this my last Will & Testament and I do hereby utterly disallow revoke and disannul all & every other former Testament Wills legacies and Bequests and Executors by me in any ways before named Willed and bequeathed ratified and Confirming this and no other to be my last will and Testament in Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal the day and year above written

In the Name of God amen I John Gordon of Charles Town Parishkeeper do make this my last will and Testament I give & bequeath all my Estate real & personal whatsoever and wheresoever to Martin Campbell James Parsons and William Guerin of Charles Town aforesaid and the Survivors & survivor of them and the heirs Executors & administrators of each survivor in Trust that they and the survivors & survivor of them & the heirs Executors and administrators of each survivor shall & will out of the Intst and profits to arise therefrom in the first place maintain Eleaz^r School and Educate Penelope the daughter of my Negro woman named Molly until the said Penelope shall arrive of the age of eighteen years and be married and then and not before pay unto her the sum of five hundred pounds lawful money of Great Britain and in Trust that they the said Martin Campbell James Parsons & William Guerin and the survivors & survivor of them do pay unto William Bassford who formerly lived with me the sum of one thousand pounds Current money of South Carolina and unto Ann Mimick of Georgia the Intst of one thousand pounds Current money during her life and after her death the said last mentioned sum of one thousand pounds Current money to the issue of her body that shall be then living to be Equally divided amongst such issue share and share alike lastly I do hereby nominate constitute and appoint the said Martin Campbell James Parsons & William Guerin and the survivors and survivor of them Executors and Executor of this my last will and Testament In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal the thirteenth day of January in the year of our Lord One thousand seven hundred and sixty two
