In the name of God amen I Sarah Ramsay of the parish of St Philips Charles Town in the Province of South Carolina Widow being sick in body but of sound and perfect mind memory & understanding do for avoiding Controversies after my decease make publish and declare this my last will and testament in manner & form following First I order all my just debts to be paid off and discharged as soon as conveniently may be after my death. I give & bequeath unto my Sister Mary Allau the sum of thirty shillings Currency to buy her a pair of shoes & attend upon her Lawyers. I leave to my Mother in Law Abigail Corman of the Island of Antigua a mourning ring. I leave to my brother in law Thomas Corman of the same Island Merchant another mourning ring. I give and bequeath to my nephew Henry Corman Son of my said Brother in law Thomas Corman the sum of one hundred pounds Currency to be paid him within twelve months after my decease. I leave to my friend Eleanor Montrie Wife of John Montrie Esq. Esq. my Diamond Ring. I give and bequeath to my niece Mary Allau the daughter of my said sister Mary Allau the sum of one hundred pounds Currency to be paid her when she arrives at the age of twenty one years or day of Marriage whichever shall first happen.

All the rest residue and Remainder of my Estate as well Real as personal whatsoever & wheresoever I give & bequeath unto John Chesborough Junior & Elizabeth Chesborough the son & dau^r

Daughter of my dear Friend John Cheesborough and to their heirs forever
to be equally divided between them share and share alike when they shall
respectively arrive at the age of Twenty five years. But with this proviso
and under this particular restraint, that they marry with their fathers
approbation and consent and in case either the said John Cheesborough
Junior or Elizabeth Cheesborough shall die before they arrive at the age
of Twenty five years or leave issue lawfully begotten my will & Intention
is that his or her share so dying shall go to and be enjoyed by the Survivor
of them. And if it shall so happen that both of them die before their
arriving at the said age and without leaving lawful issue or should they
or either of them marry without the Consent & approbation of their said
Father then and in that case I give and Bequeath the same unto my said
dear Friend John Cheesborough and to his heirs forever. And I do hereby
nominate constitute and appoint him the said John Cheesborough
sole Executor of this my last will and I do hereby authorize & fully empower
my said Exor to sell and dispose of all or any part of my Estate real as well
as personal and the monies arising from the sale thereof either to place
out on Interest or put into trade as he in his discretion shall think most
Prudent & advantageous for his said children and I do hereby revoke
cancel and make void all former and other wills by me at any time
heretofore made declaring this only to be my last Will and Testament
In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand & seal the Seventeenth
Day of June in the year of our Lord One thousand seven hundred and
sixty two
